Helping you understand Net Energy Metering with Paired Storage Bill



Net Energy Metering paired storage customers receive two separate monthly bills:

- 1. An Energy Statement provides a summary of current charges to be paid monthly.
- **2.** A **Detail of Bill** provides specifics of monthly and cumulative energy charges. Your Cumulative Energy Charges are **paid on the True-Up month** listed within this bill. Energy Charges reconciles:
 - Energy provided from the grid when you need more than your system is producing
 - Credits for the energy sent to the grid when your system produces more than is needed

Bill Basics

- At-A-Glance Account Data: Your account number and due date are at the top of every page. It's good to have this information handy if you need to call us about your energy use.
- Service For: Indicates where your charges were incurred. Some customers receive PG&E service at multiple locations, such as a home and rental property.
- Questions About Your Bill?: If you have any questions, feel free to contact us using the information found here.

Annual True-Up. Monthly Bill covers:

Summary of Monthly Charges

A Current electric charges are the minimum charges all PG&E customers pay to stay connected to the grid. Actual Energy charges (energy used from the grid minus excess energy exported throughout the year) are paid at your annual True-Up.

Your Account Summary: Provides an overview of

charges incurred this month, payments received,

and your total amount due. As a Net Energy Metering

(NEM) customer, you will pay only gas charges and minimum electric charges each month until your



Key Takeaway:Paying your Annual Energy Charges

Your True-Up month stated in #2 is when you will need to pay the cumulative energy charges stated in #4B.

This amount reconciles the energy imported from the grid with excess energy sent to the grid throughout the year.

- Account Details: Provides quick reference for your electric rate schedule, Net Energy Metering program, service and account identification numbers. It's good to have this information handy if you call us about your energy use.
- 2 True-Up Date: Indicates the month and year when your annual total energy charges and credits will be reconciled and billed.
- Billing Summary: Shows the amount due each month. The minimum charges for delivery of electricity over the grid that are paid by all residential customers. This is the same amount you will see on the Energy Statement that is paid only once per month.

- Energy Charges/Credits: Summary of Current Month's Energy Charges/Credits: Shows a snapshot of your monthly and year-to-date energy charges and credits.
 - Current Monthly Energy Charge or Credit (-): For the current billing month, shows the total of your monthly energy charges on imported electricity, net of credits you received for sending energy back to the grid. If the number is negative, you received more credits than charges for the month.
- B Cumulative Energy Charges or Credits (-): Shows how you are tracking toward your annual True-up bill. Check this number every month to ensure the amount due at True-up isn't a surprise. Minimum charges already paid throughout the year will be deducted from this balance if the amount due is greater than total minimum charges.
