

Examples of Gas and Electric Distribution Minimum Construction Requirements

Experience (ability to provide verifiable references)

- Viable firm – in business at least two years
- Ability to demonstrate solid experience in Gas and Electric Construction
- Proven Track Record Of Similar Project Experience – Supervision of firm shall have at least five years journeyman experience
- Demonstrated Adherence To Construction Schedules

Key Personnel and Organizational Structure

- Resumes of Managers, Superintendents, and Foremen
- Adequate Office, and Management Support (Org Chart)
- Yard Facilities, Shop, Warehouse, Tooling, and Other Inventory to Support Field Operations
- Maintain records in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) for a period of 2 years for audit purposes

Safety

- Review Safety Program and Personnel
- OSHA 300 Logs – 2 Years
- Experience Modification Rating – 2 Years (Below 1.0)

Insurance to Meet PG&E Requirements - minimum requirements for insurance can vary depending upon size of contact and risk level of work performed. The following is an example of the requirements for a large construction job:

- \$1 Million Workers Compensation/Employer Liability
- \$10 Million General Liability
- \$2 Million Business Auto
- \$1 Million Pollution (if work involves contact with hazardous waste)

Bonding

- Documentation from a bonding firm showing bonding capacity of \$500,000 single and \$2,000,000 aggregate

Licenses

- Active State Contractors License for applicable classification in accordance with the requirements of the Contractor's State License Board

Union Status

- Signatory in good standing with the applicable labor unions. Must provide evidence that all dues and benefits are paid in accordance with Union requirements
