ENVIRONMENTAL CLEANUP WORK TO BEGIN JUNE 6, 2016

Purpose of this Work Notice: The California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) sends this notice to inform you about cleanup work occurring from June 6, 2016 through June 24, 2016 at the former Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) gas holder and distribution facility located at 675 Jefferson Avenue in Redwood City, California, 94063 (Site). (See map below.) The three-week cleanup will involve removal of impacted soil at the Site with a former 500,000-cubic-foot above ground gas holder. Stored gas was distributed to area homes for cooking, heating and lighting from 1914 to 1959. Today, the Site has been redeveloped as a bank. As a common practice at the time before environmental regulations were in place, some impacted soil was left buried at the Site after PG&E dismantled the gas holder. Impacted soil contains metals, polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH), and volatile organic compounds (VOCs). DTSC oversees the cleanup, and PG&E will perform the work under the DTSC-approved Removal Action Workplan (RAW) and a permit from the City of Redwood City.

Work Planned: Work will begin on **June 6, 2016** and continue through **June 24, 2016, Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.** Activities include:

- Excavating about 220 cubic yards of planter area soil to a depth of about two feet;
- Transporting impacted soil in trucks off-site to licensed landfills;
- Backfilling and compacting excavations with clean imported soil; and
- Replacing all landscaping, and cleanup and restoration of the Site.

PG&E has a toll-free number for any remediation project-related inquiries and to report project impacts so they can be addressed quickly.

Community Protection Measures: PG&E and its contractors will perform all work under a site-specific Health and Safety Plan. Environmental staff will be on-site at all times to oversee the work. Measures to protect workers and the public include:

- Monitoring air in the work area and around the Site perimeter
- Controlling odor and dust with water, and odor suppression agents, as needed
- Monitoring and controlling noise
- Loading cubic yard soil boxes over plastic sheeting and sealing each box after loading is completed
- Cleaning truck tires before trucks exit the site



PG&E will coordinate all work closely with bank representatives in an effort to minimize impacts to the greatest extent possible.

What you will see: Community members can expect to see a small field crew digging with hand tools and using a small excavator. On average, two to three trucks will enter and exit the Site during working hours. Flaggers will be on-site daily to manage truck, car and pedestrian traffic.

Truck Route: Trucks will follow a City-approved truck route by turning right onto Jefferson Avenue, left on Veterans Boulevard, right on Whipple Avenue and merging onto US-101.
