Subject: Notice of Proposed Construction of Facilities Pursuant to General Order 131-D, Power Line Fulton-Molino-Cotati 60 kilovolt Relocation at Stony Point Road in the County of Sonoma

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (the Company) hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.¹

Purpose

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI, Subsections B and C.

Background

The Company has been requested by Developers for the Alameda Subdivision to relocate two poles of the existing Fulton-Molino-Cotati 60 kilovolt power line, which is located on Stony Point Road, between Yuba Drive and Hearn Avenue in Sonoma County. The relocation is necessary to accommodate the City of Santa Rosa requirement that the developers widen a portion of Stony Point Road fronting their development. The project will include the relocation of two poles (15/7 and 15/8), revising the guying on the relocated spans, and obtaining overhang rights for the relocated conductor. The pole line will be relocated westerly from its current position approximately 15-20 feet and will follow the west boundary of the proposed widening of Stony Point Road. The total length of

line affected by the relocation is approximately 745 feet. Construction is scheduled to begin in October 2001, and the new facilities should be in operation by June 2002.

This project qualifies as exempt from Permit to Construct filing requirements pursuant to G.O. 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1.(b) and (c), which exempts, "the replacement of existing power line facilities or supporting structures with equivalent facilities or structures," and "the minor relocation of existing power line facilities up to 2,000 feet in length, or the intersetting of additional support structures between existing support structures,"

Additionally, G.O. 131-D requires utilities to employ "no cost" and specified "low cost" measures to reduce public exposure to electric and magnetic fields (EMFs). The Company will install poles taller than otherwise required in order to reduce EMF strength at ground level.

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

Persons or groups may protest the proposed construction if they believe that the Company has incorrectly applied for an exemption or that the conditions set out in G.O. 131-D, Section III.B.2, exist.

Effective Date

The Company requests that this advice filing become effective on **October 6, 2001**, which is 40 days after the date of filing. (In accordance with GO 131-D, construction will not begin until 45 days after notice is first published.)
