**Advice 2226-E-A
(Pacific Gas and Electric Company ID U 39 E)**

**Subject: Revisions to Special Agreement for Electrical Standby Service
(Form 79-285) (Revised Advice Letter)**

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) hereby submits a supplemental filing for revisions only to the advice letter. The affected tariff sheets submitted in Advice 2226-E are not superceded with Advice 2226-E-A.¹

Purpose

The purpose of this filing is to correct errors in the advice letter, only.

Background

On April 9, 2002, PG&E attempted to correct an error in electric rate Schedule S – *Standby Service*. However, in correcting the typographical error, PG&E did not reference the correct advice letter (Advice 1812-E-A), in which the error first occurred. PG&E is correcting this inadvertent error. This filing does not supercede Advice 2226-E and the special agreement form (Form 79-285) identified in that advice filing is still valid for this advice filing (Advice 2226-E-A).

Thus, on November 21, 1998, the Commission's Energy Division approved Advice 1812-E-A, *Submits Changes to Schedule S – Standby and Supplements Advice 1812-E to Separate the Changes Required Therein*. After further review of this approved filing, under Special Condition #1, PG&E realized that the

reference made to reservation capacity identifies Special Condition #8, instead of Special Condition #7. PG&E is correcting this inadvertent typographical error.

In addition, in the agreement form, PG&E is deleting the explanation under "Terms and Conditions," Point 8, regarding how the reservation capacity is determined. This deletion corrects an incomplete explanation of how reservation capacity is determined. PG&E has referenced the standby tariff, which provides a complete and clear description of the determination of reservation capacity.

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, nor cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other schedule or rule.

Protests
