(Pacific Gas and Electric Company ID U 39 E)

Public Utilities Commission of the State of California

Subject: Notification of the Conveyance of Easements to Alpine County

Purpose

In accordance with Ordering Paragraph 1 of Decision (D.) 02-06-017, dated June 6, 2002, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) hereby submits a copy of the final documents to convey a permanent road easement and a temporary construction easement (or "license") by advice filing to the Commission.¹

Background

Pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 851, PG&E filed Application (A.) 02-04-024 on April 17, 2002, and requested Commission approval to: (1) grant an easement to Alpine County for realignment, maintenance and use of a road on PG&E land; and (2) grant a license for a temporary construction area on PG&E land. The Commission approved the request in D. 02-06-017, dated June 6, 2002. The decision included an order to submit final easement documents to the Commission upon execution of the documents and within 60 days of the order.

Ordering Paragraph 1 states:

"Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) is authorized to convey a road easement, and a temporary construction easement, as described in Exhibits A and B of the Application, across its property located in Alpine County in the vicinity of Blue Lakes Road to Alpine County. When the final easement documents are executed, PG&E shall submit a copy by advice letter filing within sixty (60) days of this order."

¹ PG&E reserves all legal rights to challenge the decisions or statutes under which it has been required to make this advice filing, and nothing in this advice filing constitutes a waiver of such rights. Also, PG&E reserves any additional legal rights to challenge the requirement to make this advice filing by reason of its status as a debtor under Chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code, and nothing in this advice filing constitutes a waiver of such rights.

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, nor conflict with any rate schedule or rule.

Effective Date

PG&E requests that this advice filing become effective on regular notice, **September 9, 2002**, which is 40 days after the date of filing.
