Subject: Additional Lamp for Street Light Schedule LS-2A

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) hereby submits for filing revisions to its electric tariffs. The affected tariff sheets are listed on the enclosed Attachment I.

Purpose

PG&E requests the Commission approve an additional lamp wattage for Electric Rate Schedule LS-2A Customer Owned Street and Highway Lighting.

Proposed Additions and Revisions to Tariffs

PG&E proposes to include a 165 watt Induction lamp to Electric Rate Schedule LS-2A since governmental agencies are requesting this lamp size. Cities and Counties seek to reduce their maintenance costs by utilizing this lamp type.

Tariff sheets from Electric Rate Schedule LS-2A are attached to indicate the proposed changes.

Effective Date

PG&E requests that this advice filing become effective on regular notice, **July 21, 2006**, which is 30 days after the date of filing. Due to an upgrade of the billing and information systems, PG&E intends to provide the lamp option upon the date granted by the Commission, but will begin retroactive billing when the billing and information systems are able to do so.

Protests

Anyone wishing to protest this filing may do so by sending a letter by **July 11, 2006**, which is 20 days from the date of this filing. The protest must state the grounds upon which it is based, including such items as financial and service impact, and should be submitted expeditiously. Protests should be mailed to:
