131-D, for the Construction of the Tesoro Golden Eagle  
Switchyard Project**

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (the Company) hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

**Purpose**

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

**Background**

Tesoro Refining and Marketing Company has requested that the Company relocate a short portion of its existing Pittsburg to Sobrante 230kV power line at the Tesoro Golden Eagle Refinery in Contra Costa County in order to provide improved reliability and accommodate modifications at the refinery. The Company plans to create a loop extending from the existing lines approximately 150 feet into and out of a switchyard at the refinery, for a total length of approximately 300 feet. The lines will be supported by one new structure at the switchyard in each direction. The proposed utility line relocation is located within the fence line of the refinery, approximately 800 feet east of the intersection of Solano Way and Monsanto Way in Contra Costa County.

Construction is expected to begin in January, 2007, or as soon as possible thereafter, and to be completed by September, 2007, or as soon as possible thereafter.

This project qualifies as exempt from Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity filing requirements, pursuant to G.O. 131-D, Section III, Subsection A, which exempts, "the minor relocation of existing power line facilities."

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

**NOTICE OF PROPOSED CONSTRUCTION**

**PROJECT NAME:** Tesoro Golden Eagle Switchyard Project, Contra Costa County  
**ADVICE LETTER NUMBER:** 2917-E

**Proposed Project:** Tesoro Refining and Marketing Company has requested that Pacific Gas and Electric Company relocate a short portion of its existing Pittsburg to Sobrante 230kV power line at the Tesoro Golden Eagle Refinery in Contra Costa County in order to provide improved reliability and accommodate modifications at the refinery. Pacific Gas and Electric plans to create a loop extending from the existing lines approximately 150 feet into and out of a switchyard at the refinery, for a total length of approximately 300 feet. The lines will be supported by one new structure at the switchyard in each direction. The proposed utility line relocation is located within the fence line of the refinery, approximately 800 feet east of the intersection of Solano Way and Monsanto Way in Contra Costa County.

Construction is expected to begin in January, 2007, or as soon as possible thereafter, and to be completed by September, 2007, or as soon as possible thereafter.

**Exemption from CPUC Permit Requirement:** CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III.A, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. Pacific Gas and Electric Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption(s):

- The minor relocation of existing power line facilities.

**Public Review Process:** Persons or groups may protest the proposed construction if they believe that Pacific Gas and Electric Company has incorrectly applied for an exemption or that the conditions set out in Section III.B.2 of General Order 131-D exist;

- a. There is reasonable possibility that the activity may have an impact on an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies; or
- b. The cumulative impact of successive projects of the same type in the same place, over time, is significant; or
- c. There is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances.

Protests should include the following:

1. Your name, mailing address and daytime telephone number.
2. Reference to the CPUC Advice Letter Number and Project Name.
3. A clear description of the reason for the protest.
4. Whether you believe that evidentiary hearings are necessary to resolve factual disputes.
