**Subject: Submits Notice of Construction, Pursuant to General Order 131-D, for the Construction of the Christie – Willow Pass 60 Kilovolt (kV) Transmission Pole Replacement Project**

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (the Company) hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

**Purpose**

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

**Background**

The Company has been requested by Bay Point Ventures One, LLC to relocate a pole on the Christie – Willow Pass 60kV transmission line to allow for the extension of Pacifica Avenue across Port Chicago Highway in Contra Costa County. In order to relocate this pole, the Company will replace it with a slightly taller pole approximately seven feet to the south of the intersection and will also replace one adjacent pole with a pole approximately five feet taller than the existing pole in order to maintain adequate ground clearances. Work on this project is expected to begin in May, 2007, or as soon thereafter as possible, and to be completed by May, 2008, or as soon thereafter as possible.

This project qualifies as exempt from Permit to Construct filing requirements, pursuant to G.O. 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1 which exempts, “the replacement of existing power line facilities or supporting structures with equivalent facilities or structures” and “power line facilities to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement.”

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

## NOTICE OF PROPOSED CONSTRUCTION

**PROJECT NAME: CHRISTIE – WILLOW PASS 60 KILOVOLT (kV) TRANSMISSION POLE RELOCATION PROJECT**  
**ADVICE LETTER NUMBER: 3008-E**

**Proposed Project:** Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) has been requested by Bay Point Ventures One, LLC to relocate a pole on the Christie – Willow Pass 60kV transmission line to allow for the extension of Pacifica Avenue across Port Chicago Highway in Contra Costa County. In order to relocate this pole, PG&E will replace it with a slightly taller pole approximately seven feet to the south of the intersection and will also replace one adjacent pole with a pole approximately five feet taller than the existing pole in order to maintain adequate ground clearances. Work on this project is expected to begin in May, 2007, or as soon thereafter as possible, and to be completed by May, 2008, or as soon thereafter as possible.

**Exemption from CPUC Permit Requirement:** CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, B.1, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. Pacific Gas and Electric Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption(s):

- The replacement of existing power line facilities or supporting structures with equivalent facilities or structures,
- Power line facilities to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement.

**Public Review Process:** Persons or groups may protest the proposed construction if they believe that Pacific Gas and Electric Company has incorrectly applied for an exemption or that the conditions set out in Section III.B.2 of General Order 131-D exist;

- a. There is reasonable possibility that the activity may have an impact on an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies; or
- b. The cumulative impact of successive projects of the same type in the same place, over time, is significant; or
- c. There is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances.

Protests should include the following:

1. Your name, mailing address and daytime telephone number.
2. Reference to the CPUC Advice Letter Number and Project Name.
3. A clear description of the reason for the protest.
4. Whether you believe that evidentiary hearings are necessary to resolve factual disputes.
