Pacific Gas and Electric Company (the Company) hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

Purpose

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

Background

The Company has been requested by Caltrans to relocate a 1,300-foot segment of the Dinuba-Orosi 70 kilovolt power line at the intersection of State Route 63 and Avenue 408 in the City of Cutler. To relocate the line, three wood poles will be relocated 9-12 feet north of their current locations on Avenue 408 and a fourth pole will be relocated 9-12 feet north of its current location at the northeast corner of intersection State Route 63 and Avenue 408. These relocations are being made to accommodate road widening work that will be undertaken by Caltrans on Avenue 408, and the relocations will remain within the Avenue 408 franchise. Work will commence in September, 2007, or as soon thereafter as possible, and will be completed by January, 2008, or as soon thereafter as possible.

This project qualifies as exempt from Permit to Construct filing requirements, pursuant to G.O. 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1.c, g, which exempts the following:

c. The minor relocation of existing power line facilities up to 2,000 feet in

length, or the intersetting of additional support structures between existing support structures; and

- g. Transmission line and power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement.

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CONSTRUCTION

PROJECT NAME: Dinuba-Orosi 70 Kilovolt (State Route 63 & Avenue 408) Power Line Relocation - Cutler, CA
ADVICE LETTER NUMBER: 3030-E

Proposed Project: Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) has been requested by Caltrans to relocate a 1,300-foot segment of the Dinuba-Orosi 70 kilovolt power line at the intersection of State Route 63 and Avenue 408 in the City of Cutler. To relocate the line, three wood poles will be relocated 9-12 feet north of their current locations on Avenue 408 and a fourth pole will be relocated 9-12 feet north of its current location at the northeast corner of intersection State Route 63 and Avenue 408. These relocations are being made to accommodate road widening work that will be undertaken by Caltrans on Avenue 408, and the relocations will remain within the Avenue 408 franchise. Work will commence in September, 2007, or as soon thereafter as possible, and will be completed by January, 2008, or as soon thereafter as possible.

Exemption from CPUC Permit Requirement: CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, B.1, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. Pacific Gas and Electric Company believe that this project qualifies for the following exemptions:

- c. The minor relocation of existing power line facilities up to 2,000 feet in length, or the intersetting of additional support structures between existing support structures; and
- g) Transmission line and power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement.

Public Review Process: Persons or groups may protest the proposed construction if they believe that Pacific Gas and Electric Company has incorrectly applied for an exemption or that the conditions set out in Section III.B.2 of General Order 131-D exist;

- a. There is reasonable possibility that the activity may have an impact on an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies; or
- c.b. The cumulative impact of successive projects of the same type in the same place, over time, is significant; or
- e.c. There is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances.

Protests should include the following:

1. Your name, mailing address and daytime telephone number.
2. Reference to the CPUC Advice Letter Number and Project Name.
3. A clear description of the reason for the protest.
- 5.4. Whether you believe that evidentiary hearings are necessary to resolve factual disputes.
