Pacific Gas and Electric Company (the Company) hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

**Purpose**

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

**Background**

In order to accommodate Global Common, LLC's new Chow III biomass generation project located in the southerly portion of the City of Chowchilla, the Company has been requested to perform necessary network upgrades, specifically to replace existing wires (conductors) with new wires (reconductor) on approximately 1.4 miles of the Certainteed Tap 115 kilovolt power line in the City of Chowchilla and the County of Madera. The reconductoring of the existing power line, which is in franchise on the northeasterly side of Chowchilla Boulevard, will occur along the existing route beginning at the Certainteed Tap 115 kilovolt junction near the Company's Chowchilla Substation (located adjacent to Chowchilla Boulevard approximately one half mile southeasterly of E. Robertson Boulevard), and extending southeasterly along Chowchilla Boulevard approximately 1.4 miles to the Chowchilla #1 Tap 115 kilovolt junction located adjacent to Chowchilla Boulevard near the Avenue 24 1/2 alignment within the County of Madera. The Company will not be replacing any poles. Work is expected to begin in August, 2007, or as soon thereafter as possible, and to be completed by September, 2007, or as soon thereafter as possible.

This project qualifies as exempt from Permit to Construct filing requirements, pursuant to G.O. 131-D, Section III, Subsections B.1.b, e, and g, which exempt the following:

- b) The replacement of existing power line facilities or supporting structures with equivalent facilities or structures.
- e) The placing of new or additional conductors, insulators, or their accessories on supporting structures already built.
- g) Power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement.

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

## NOTICE OF PROPOSED CONSTRUCTION

**PROJECT NAME:** Certainteed Tap 115 Kilovolt Power Line Reconductoring, City of Chowchilla, County of Madera  
**ADVICE LETTER NUMBER:** 3069-E

**Proposed Project:** In order to accommodate Global Common, LLC's new Chow III biomass generation project located in the southerly portion of the City of Chowchilla, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) has been requested to perform necessary network upgrades, specifically to replace existing wires (conductors) with new wires (reconductor) on approximately 1.4 miles of the Certainteed Tap 115 kilovolt power line in the City of Chowchilla and the County of Madera. The reconductoring of the existing power line, which is in franchise on the northeasterly side of Chowchilla Boulevard, will occur along the existing route beginning at the Certainteed Tap 115 kilovolt junction near PG&E's Chowchilla Substation (located adjacent to Chowchilla Boulevard approximately one half mile southeasterly of E. Robertson Boulevard), and extending southeasterly along Chowchilla Boulevard approximately 1.4 miles to the Chowchilla #1 Tap 115 kilovolt junction located adjacent to Chowchilla Boulevard near the Avenue 24 1/2 alignment within the County of Madera. PG&E will not be replacing any poles. Work is expected to begin in August, 2007, or as soon thereafter as possible, and to be completed by September, 2007, or as soon thereafter as possible.

**Exemption from CPUC Permit Requirement:** CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, B.1, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. Pacific Gas and Electric Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption:

- b) The replacement of existing power line facilities or supporting structures with equivalent facilities or structures.
- e) The placing of new or additional conductors, insulators, or their accessories on supporting structures already built.
- g) Power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement.

**Public Review Process:** Persons or groups may protest the proposed construction if they believe that Pacific Gas and Electric Company has incorrectly applied for an exemption or that the conditions set out in Section III.B.2 of General Order 131-D exist;

- a. There is reasonable possibility that the activity may have an impact on an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies; or
- c.b. The cumulative impact of successive projects of the same type in the same place, over time, is significant; or
- e.c. There is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances.

Protests should include the following:

- 1. Your name, mailing address and daytime telephone number.
- 2. Reference to the CPUC Advice Letter Number and Project Name.
- 3. A clear description of the reason for the protest.
- 5.4. Whether you believe that evidentiary hearings are necessary to resolve factual disputes.
