Subject: Communication of Pacific Gas & Electric Company's Tariff Sheet Numbering System Pursuant to Decision 07-01-024 and General Rule 8.4.3

Purpose

This filing is in compliance with General Rule 8.4.3 of General Order (GO) 96-B and hereby notifies the Commission of the intent of Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) to continue its existing tariff numbering system.

Background

Decision No. (D.) 07-01-024 (the Decision), dated January 29, 2007, is the Fourth Interim Decision in Rulemaking 98-07-038, Rulemaking for the Purposes of Revising General Order 96-A Regarding Informal Filings at the Commission, and adopted the bulk of the previously proposed revisions to General Order (GO) 96-A, which governs utility tariffs (including their form, content, and publication) and the advice letters by which they are amended. The Decision adopted the remainder of General Rules that complement the individual rules that were adopted in the previous three interim decisions. All of the adopted rules now constitute GO 96-B, which supersedes GO 96-A in its entirety.

The new GO 96-B, as contained in Appendix A to the Decision, directed in General Rule 8.4.3, Transitional Provisions, that the utilities notify the appropriate Industry Division by advice letter within 90 days of the effective date of these General Rules in order to specify whether it elects to (a) continue the sheet numbering system already utilized by the utility (including in its advice letter a complete explanation of the existing sheet numbering system), or (b) conform its sheet numbering system to the requirements of General Rule 8.4.2.

PG&E hereby notifies the Commission's Energy Division that it elects to continue its existing sheet numbering system, and that this sheet numbering conforms to the sheet numbering specifications set forth in the last effective version of General Order 96-A. Furthermore, as directed in General Rule 8.4.3, PG&E will maintain its historical tariff record so that it may provide, upon written request and within a reasonable time, the text for any tariff (or portion thereof) no longer in effect.

PG&E's existing sheet numbering system can be described as follows:

- All tariff sheets are transmitted via an advice letter.
- PG&E utilizes a standard sequential, numerical numbering system for each tariff sheet it submits to the Commission. In this system the first sheet was designated as CPUC Sheet No. 1-E or 1-G, followed by CPUC Sheet No. 2-E or 2-G, etc., over time.
- Each time a tariff sheet is modified and transmitted via an advice letter, the tariff sheet number is revised with the next available, sequential number. This modification not only includes the reference of the new sheet number but it also includes a reference to the sheet number just replaced or superseded. This cross-referencing process supports the integrity of PG&E's historical tariff sheets.
- A revised table of contents sheet is transmitted with each advice letter.
