**Subject: Election of 2004 Long-Term Request for Offers PPAs for Energy
Auction Cost Allocation Mechanism**

Pursuant to California Public Utilities Commission (“Commission”) Decision (“D”) 07-09-044, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (“PG&E”) hereby elects to submit certain 2004 Long-Term Request for Offers (“2004 LTRFO”) Power Purchase Agreements (“PPAs”) for cost recovery through the D.06-07-029 energy auction cost allocation mechanism.

Background

On September 21, 2007, the Commission issued D.07-09-044, adopting, with clarifications, a May 11, 2007, Joint Settlement Agreement (“Settlement”) presented by Settling Parties¹ outlining principles for the process and products to be included in an energy auction under D.06-07-029. Pursuant to Ordering Paragraph 3 of D.07-09-044, PG&E is filing this advice letter to make an election as to which of the five PPA resources from its 2004 LTRFO results, as approved by the Commission in D.06-11-048, would be subject to the D.06-07-029 energy auction cost allocation mechanism.
