for the Replacement of 53 Wood Poles on the Caruthers-Kingsburg  
70kV Power Line, County of Fresno**

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (the Company) hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

**Purpose**

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

**Background**

In order to accommodate the replacement of 12 Kilovolt (12kV) distribution wires attached to poles below the Caruthers-Kingsburg 70 Kilovolt (70kV) power line in the County of Fresno, the Company will be replacing approximately 53 wood power poles (replacement of existing facilities) in the existing Caruthers-Kingsburg 70kV power line. The replacement of the 12kV distribution wires is needed to continue to provide for the increasing electrical demand and to improve reliability in the southerly portions of Fresno County. The line is located in a rural agricultural area along the southerly side of Harlan Avenue (existing franchise) in Fresno County, starting at a point approximately 4,000 feet easterly of Marks Avenue and extending westerly along the southerly side of Harlan Avenue approximately 3.2 miles to the easterly side of Polk Avenue (existing franchise). In order to maintain legal ground clearances, most poles will be increased approximately 5 feet in height (most existing poles are approximately 55 feet tall), and one 60-foot tall wood pole will be raised approximately 15 feet in height to accommodate the framing required to attach to an adjacent line segment. Work is

scheduled to begin in November 2008, or as soon thereafter as possible, and will be completed by May 2009, or as soon thereafter as possible.

CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1., exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. The Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption(s),

- b) the replacement of existing power line facilities or supporting structures with equivalent facilities or structures.
- g) power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement; or in a utility corridor designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies for which a final Negative Declaration or EIR finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts.

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

### **Protests**

## NOTICE OF PROPOSED CONSTRUCTION

**PROJECT NAME:** Caruthers-Kingsburg 70kV – Distribution Reconductor Project, County of Fresno  
**ADVICE LETTER NUMBER:** 3352-E

**Proposed Project:** In order to accommodate the replacement of 12 Kilovolt (12kV) distribution wires attached to poles below the Caruthers-Kingsburg 70 Kilovolt (70kV) power line in the County of Fresno, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) will be replacing approximately 53 wood power poles (replacement of existing facilities) in the existing Caruthers-Kingsburg 70kV power line. The replacement of the 12kV distribution wires is needed to continue to provide for the increasing electrical demand and to improve reliability in the southerly portions of Fresno County. The line is located in a rural agricultural area along the southerly side of Harlan Avenue (existing franchise) in Fresno County, starting at a point approximately 4,000 feet easterly of Marks Avenue and extending westerly along the southerly side of Harlan Avenue approximately 3.2 miles to the easterly side of Polk Avenue (existing franchise). In order to maintain legal ground clearances, most poles will be increased approximately 5 feet in height (most existing poles are approximately 55 feet tall), and one 60-foot tall wood pole will be raised approximately 15 feet in height to accommodate the framing required to attach to an adjacent line segment. Pacific Gas and Electric Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption(s):

- b) the replacement of existing power line facilities or supporting structures with equivalent facilities or structures.
- g) power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement; or in a utility corridor designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies for which a final Negative Declaration or EIR finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts.

**Public Review Process:** Persons or groups may protest the proposed construction if they believe that Pacific Gas and Electric Company has incorrectly applied for an exemption or that the conditions set out in Section III.B.2 of General Order 131-D exist;

- a. There is reasonable possibility that the activity may have an impact on an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies; or
- b. The cumulative impact of successive projects of the same type in the same place, over time, is significant; or
- c. There is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances.

Protests should include the following:

- 1. Your name, mailing address and daytime telephone number.
- 2. Reference to the CPUC Advice Letter Number and Project Name.
- 3. A clear description of the reason for the protest.
- 4. Whether you believe that evidentiary hearings are necessary to resolve factual disputes.
