Subject: Submits Notice of Construction, Pursuant to General Order 131-D, for the Carbona #1 60kV Tap Reconductoring Project - City of Tracy and County of San Joaquin

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (the Company) hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

Purpose

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

Background

In order to improve reliability to customers in the City of Tracy, the Company is proposing to replace the existing wires with new wires (reconductor) on the Carbona #1 60 kilovolt (60kV) power line (Tap) in the City of Tracy and San Joaquin County. The first segment of the project begins just north of the intersection of Charlemagne Lane and South MacArthur Drive in Tracy and trends south for 2.7 miles along the west side of South MacArthur Drive (existing franchise) to the terminus at Carbona Substation. Along this segment, the Company plans to replace 18 existing wood poles with new wood poles approximately 5 to 15 feet taller, and to replace one wood pole with a light-duty steel pole (replacement of existing facilities). The second segment of the project includes reconductoring a 1000-foot section of the Tap next to Kasson Substation at the southeast intersection of Kasson Road and Mancuso Road in San Joaquin County (existing easement). This will require intersetting a new wood pole (intersetting of additional support structures) and replacing a wood

pole with a new tubular steel pole (TSP). The specific location near Kasson Substation requires this self-supporting TSP because a wood pole would require additional supporting structures and guy wiring. The TSP will be 55 feet tall and substantially shorter than surrounding lattice structures in the immediate area. Work is scheduled to begin in February 2009, or as soon thereafter as possible, and will be completed by May 2009, or as soon thereafter as possible.

CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. The Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemptions:

- b) The replacement of existing power line facilities or supporting structures with equivalent facilities or structures.
- c) The minor relocation of existing power line facilities up to 2000 feet in length, or the intersetting of additional support structures between existing support structures.
- g) Power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement.

Additionally, G.O. 131-D requires utilities to employ "no cost" and specified "low cost" measures to reduce public exposure to electric and magnetic fields (EMFs) in accordance with CPUC Decision 06-01-042 and the "EMF Guidelines for Electrical Facilities." The following measures are proposed for this project:

- Increase the height of overhead lines, more than otherwise required, to reduce EMF strength at ground level.

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

Protests

Anyone wishing to protest this filing may do so by filing a protest with the CPUC and the Company by **January 12, 2009**¹, which is 21 days after the date of this filing. Protests should be mailed to the following address:

Electric and Magnetic Fields (EMF): Pacific Gas and Electric Company will employ "no cost" and specified "low cost" measures to reduce public exposure to EMF in accordance with California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) Decision 06-01-042 and Pacific Gas and Electric Company's "EMF Design Guidelines for Electrical Facilities." The following measures are proposed for this project:

- Increase the height of overhead lines, more than otherwise required, to reduce EMF strength at ground level.

Exemption from CPUC Permit Requirement: CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, B.1, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. Pacific Gas and Electric Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemptions:

- b. The replacement of existing power line facilities or supporting structures with equivalent facilities or structures.
- c. The minor relocation of existing power line facilities up to 2000 feet in length, or the intersetting of additional support structures between existing support structures.
- g. Power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement.

Public Review Process: Persons or groups may protest the proposed construction if they believe that Pacific Gas and Electric Company has incorrectly applied for an exemption or that the conditions set out in Section III.B.2 of General Order 131-D exist;

- a. There is reasonable possibility that the activity may have an impact on an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies; or
- b. The cumulative impact of successive projects of the same type in the same place, over time, is significant; or
- c. There is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances.

Protests should include the following:

1. Your name, mailing address and daytime telephone number.
2. Reference to the CPUC Advice Letter Number and Project Name.
3. A clear description of the reason for the protest.
4. Whether you believe that evidentiary hearings are necessary to resolve factual disputes.

Within 30 days after Pacific Gas and Electric Company has submitted its response, the Executive Director of the CPUC will send you a copy of an Executive Resolution granting or denying the request and stating the reasons for the decision.
