**Subject: Modifications to Exhibit “C” of the Existing Agreement with San Francisco Bay Area Rapid Transit District**

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) hereby submits, in accordance with General Order (G.O.) 96-B, Energy Industry Rule 5.3.5, a modification to the existing *Agreement between San Francisco Bay Area Rapid Transit District and Pacific Gas and Electric Company for Specified CPUC Jurisdictional Electrical Services* (Agreement). These modifications are necessary to accommodate the San Francisco Bay Area Rapid Transit District’s (BART) request to update Exhibit “C”, Miscellaneous Power Locations, to include the newly completed East Dublin Parking Garage.

**Purpose**

The purpose of this filing is to modify Exhibit “C” of the Agreement to update the list to include BART’s new power delivery location.

**Background**

BART takes Network Integration Transmission Service (NITS) under PG&E’s Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) jurisdictional Open Access Transmission (OAT) tariff. In conjunction with the NITS, PG&E provides certain services to BART pursuant to the Agreement. The Agreement was the result of Investigation and Suspension (I&S) Case No. 99-06-002. PG&E filed the Agreement on behalf of both BART and PG&E, and the CPUC approved the Agreement in Decision (D.) 00-10-015 dated October 5, 2000.

On June 1, 2009, PG&E filed at FERC, revisions to the NITS under PG&E’s OAT to reflect BART’s newly completed East Dublin Parking Garage (Docket No. ER09-1241-000). PG&E requested that the modifications have an effective date of August 1, 2009.

**Modifications to the Agreement**

PG&E is requesting that the East Dublin Parking Garage be added to Exhibit "C", Miscellaneous Power Stations, of the Agreement.

This filing will not affect any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any rate schedule or rule.

**Protest Period**

Anyone wishing to protest this filing may do so by sending a letter by **June 23, 2009**, which is **20 days** from the date of this filing. The protest must state the grounds upon which it is based, including such items as financial and service impact, and should be submitted expeditiously. Protests should be mailed to:
