Purpose

PG&E submits this advice letter to request approval for modifications to Electric Form 79-1130 - *Customer Request Form not to Receive Net Surplus Compensation*

Background

On July 11, 2011, PG&E submitted Advice Letter 3870-E to comply with Decision (D.) 11-06-016 regarding Net Surplus Compensation pursuant to Assembly Bill 920. Included in the filing was form 79-1130. PG&E in this Advice Letter, submits a revised form 79-1130 in order to:

- (1) include a new option to allow customers who have opted out of the net compensation program to opt back into the net surplus compensation program; and
- (2) make formatting and other minor wording changes to make the form more "customer friendly"; and
- (3) revise the title of the form from ***Customer Request Form not to Receive Net Surplus Compensation*** to ***Request to Opt-out of / Opt-in to Compensation for Surplus Electricity***
