Pacific Gas and Electric Company (“PG&E”) hereby submits this supplemental advice filing to correct a ministerial error in the Tariff Revisions section of Advice 3976-E filed in compliance with Decision 11-12-038.

Purpose and Revision

PG&E is submitting this supplemental advice filing to revise text on page 4 of Advice 3976-E. The 4th bullet under the PGC-EE Decision section incorrectly references the Procurement Energy Efficiency Revenue Adjustment Mechanism (PEERAM). Replacing “procurement portion” with “electric portion” was made in the Procurement Energy Efficiency Balancing Account (PEEBA) and this proposed revision is incorporated in the 2nd bullet.

Therefore, the 4th bullet should be removed and the PGC-EE Decision section on page 4 should read as follows:

PGC-EE Decision

In compliance with the PGC-EE Decision, PG&E proposes the following tariff changes to be effective January 1, 2012:

- 1) Revise the PPPRAM to continue the former “PGC legacy” portion of Energy Efficiency funding in that account.
- 2) Revise Preliminary Statement Part DI, “Procurement Energy Efficiency Balancing Account (PEEBA),” to consolidate tracking of the electric portion of energy efficiency expenditures into one account.

- 3) Close the electric Public Purpose Program Energy Efficiency Balancing Account (PPPEEBA) in Electric Preliminary Statement Part P, "Customer Energy Efficiency Adjustment (CEEIA)."
- ~~4) Replace "procurement portion" with "electric portion" in Preliminary Statement Part EF, "Procurement Energy Efficiency Revenue Adjustment Mechanism (PEERAM)."~~
- 4)5) Remove reference to the closed PPPEEBA account in Electric Preliminary Statement Part FE, "On-Bill Financing Balancing Account (OBFBA-electric)."
- 5)6) Make other clarifying revisions for consistency.

Protests

Since this supplemental filing makes a non-substantive ministerial correction to a Tier 1 advice letter, PG&E requests that, pursuant to Section 7.5.1 of General Order 96-B, the protest period not be re-opened.

Effective Date

PG&E requests that this supplemental advice filing be approved concurrent with the effective date for Advice 3976-E, which is **January 1, 2012**. This supplement is submitted as a **Tier 1** designation.
