for the Construction of the Waukena Switching Station and Solar Project Interconnection in the City of Corcoran, County of Kings

Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E" or "the Company") hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order ("G.O.") 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

Purpose

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

Background

In order to connect Solar Project Solutions' planned Corcoran Solar Generation Facilities Project to PG&E's electrical system in Kings County, PG&E is proposing the Waukena Switching Station, a 3.52-acre switching station located approximately onehalf mile east of the intersection of the Central Valley Highway (Hwy 43) and Nevada Avenue, on the north side of Nevada Avenue, adjacent to the existing Kingsburg-Corcoran 115 (kV) Power Line, in a rural area north of Corcoran. To interconnect the new switching station to the existing power line, PG&E will replace three existing 75foot-tall lattice steel poles with four 70- to 90-foot-tall tubular steel poles within the existing power line alignment located approximately 120 feet from the west side of the switching station. From two of the new poles, PG&E will construct approximately 120foot-long power line spans to loop the line into and out of the switching station. The potential environmental impacts of PG&E's interconnection facilities were analyzed in the Mitigated Negative Declaration adopted for the Corcoran Irrigation Solar Generation Facilities Project, which found no significant unavoidable environmental impacts caused by the interconnection facilities (larger project CEQA). Construction is scheduled to begin in February 2012 or as soon thereafter as possible, with completion in February 2013 or as soon as possible after construction is completed.

CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1.F, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. The Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption(s):

f) Power lines or substations to be relocated or constructed which have undergone environmental review pursuant to CEQA as part of a larger project, and for which the final CEQA document (Environmental Impact Report (EIR) or Negative Declaration) finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts caused by the proposed line or substation.

The Kings County Planning Commission, County of Kings, adopted a Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Solar Project Solutions Corcoran Solar Generation Facility, finding no significant unavoidable environmental impacts resulting from PG&E's proposed facilities. (State Clearinghouse #2010121062.) The environmental review included PG&E's interconnection facilities and found no significant unavoidable environmental impacts.

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

Protests

- c. There is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances.

Protests should include the following:

- 1. Your name, mailing address and daytime telephone number.
- 2. Reference to the CPUC Advice Letter Number and Project Name.
- 3. A clear description of the reason for the protest.
- 4. Whether you believe that evidentiary hearings are necessary to resolve factual disputes.
