Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E" or "the Company") hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

Purpose

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

Background

To accommodate customer distribution service needs, Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E) proposes to replace existing distribution wires beneath the Valley Springs-Martell #2 60kV power line (existing easement) in Amador County. In order to accommodate the new distribution wires, PG&E proposes to replace approximately 11 wood poles with approximately 5- to 15- feet-taller wood poles (equivalent structures). There will be no change in the capacity of the power line. The project begins at the northwest corner of the intersection of Old Amador Road and Bunker Hill Road and continues north spanning over Rancheria Creek and New Chicago Road for approximately 1.5 miles where the final pole will be replaced approximately 1,200 feet northeast of the intersection of Bunker Hill Road and New Chicago Road. Construction is proposed to begin August 2012 or as soon as possible thereafter to meet the customer's schedule.

CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1.x, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application

requesting authority to construct. The Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption(s),

b. The replacement of existing power line facilities or supporting structures with equivalent facilities or structures.

g. Power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement; or in a utility corridor designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies for which a final Negative Declaration or EIR finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts.

Proposed Project: To accommodate customer distribution service needs, Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E) proposes to replace existing distribution wires beneath the Valley Springs-Martell #2 60kV power line (existing easement) in Amador County. Pacific Gas and Electric Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption(s):

- b. The replacement of existing power line facilities or supporting structures with equivalent facilities or structures.
- g. power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement; or in a utility corridor designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies for which a final Negative Declaration or EIR finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts.

Public Review Process: Persons or groups may protest the proposed construction if they believe that Pacific Gas and Electric Company has incorrectly applied for an exemption or that the conditions set out in Section III.B.2 of General Order 131-D exist;

- a. There is reasonable possibility that the activity may have an impact on an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies; or
- b. The cumulative impact of successive projects of the same type in the same place, over time, is significant; or
- c. There is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances.

Protests should include the following:

- 1. Your name, mailing address and daytime telephone number.
- 2. Reference to the CPUC Advice Letter Number and Project Name.
- 3. A clear description of the reason for the protest.
- 4. Whether you believe that evidentiary hearings are necessary to resolve factual disputes.
