Subject: Submits Notice of Construction, Pursuant to General Order 131-D, for the Construction of the McCall-Kingsburg No. 1 and No. 2, 115 kV Power Line (County of Fresno and City of Selma)

Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E" or "the Company") hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

Purpose

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

Background

To maintain compliance with CPUC General Order 95 clearance requirements, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) will replace a top-cage extension on one approximately 79-foot-tall tower within McCall Substation (PG&E property), increasing its height by approximately 10 feet (placement of new or additional accessories) and replace 19 lattice steel poles with tubular steel poles along the approximately 12-mile-long McCall-Kingsburg 115 Kilovolt (kV) Power Line in Fresno County (existing easement). The power line begins at McCall Substation (located on Leonard Avenue approximately 0.4 mile north of Manning Avenue) and traverses easterly and southerly through unincorporated Fresno County and the eastern side of the City of Selma, paralleling South Del Rey Avenue and terminating at Kingsburg Substation (located near the intersection of Elkhorn Avenue and South Bethel Avenue). At select locations along the line, PG&E will replace 19 approximately 77 to 86-foot-tall lattice steel poles with approximately 90-foot-tall tubular steel poles, increasing their height by approximately 4 to 13 feet (replacement of existing facilities). All 19 poles are located within PG&E's easement within the City of Selma (3 poles) and unincorporated Fresno County (16 poles). Construction activities are scheduled to begin in October 2012, or

as soon thereafter as possible, with completion in November 2012 or as soon thereafter as possible.

CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, Subsection B, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. The Company believes these projects qualify for the following exemption:

- b. the replacement of existing power line facilities or supporting structures with equivalent facilities or structures.
- e. the placing of new or additional conductors, insulators, or their accessories on supporting structures already built.
- g. power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement; or in a utility corridor designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies for which a final Negative Declaration or EIR finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts.

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

Proposed Project: To maintain compliance with CPUC General Order 95 clearance requirements, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) will replace a top-cage extension on one approximately 79-foot-tall tower within McCall Substation (PG&E property), increasing its height by approximately 10 feet (placement of new or additional accessories) and replace 19 lattice steel poles with tubular steel poles along the approximately 12-mile-long McCall-Kingsburg 115 Kilovolt (kV) Power Line in Fresno County (existing easement). The power line begins at McCall Substation (located on Leonard Avenue approximately 0.4 mile north of Manning Avenue) and traverses easterly and southerly through unincorporated Fresno County and the eastern side of the City of Selma, paralleling South Del Rey Avenue and terminating at Kingsburg Substation (located near the intersection of Elkhorn Avenue and South Bethel Avenue). At select locations along the line, PG&E will replace 19 approximately 77 to 86-foot-tall lattice steel poles with approximately 90-foot-tall tubular steel poles, increasing their height by approximately 4 to 13 feet (replacement of existing facilities). All 19 poles are located within PG&E's easement within the City of Selma (3 poles) and unincorporated Fresno County (16 poles). Construction activities are scheduled to begin in October 2012, or as soon thereafter as possible, with completion in November 2012 or as soon thereafter as possible.

Exemption from CPUC Authority: CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, B.1, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. Pacific Gas and Electric Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption:

- b. the replacement of existing power line facilities or supporting structures with equivalent facilities or structures.
- e. the placing of new or additional conductors, insulators, or their accessories on supporting structures already built.
- g. power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement; or in a utility corridor designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies for which a final Negative Declaration or EIR finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts.

Public Review Process: Persons or groups may protest the proposed construction if they believe that Pacific Gas and Electric Company has incorrectly applied for an exemption or that the conditions set out in Section III.B.2 of General Order 131-D exist;

- a. There is reasonable possibility that the activity may have an impact on an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies; or
- b. The cumulative impact of successive projects of the same type in the same place, over time, is significant; or
- c. There is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances.

Protests should include the following:

- 1. Your name, mailing address and daytime telephone number.
- 2. Reference to the CPUC Advice Letter Number and Project Name.
- 3. A clear description of the reason for the protest.
- 4. Whether you believe that evidentiary hearings are necessary to resolve factual disputes.
