Subject: Electric Rate Schedule NEMVMASH Deviation**Purpose**

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) hereby seeks approval for a deviation from its Electric Rate Schedule NEMVMASH to accommodate a PV system for a multifamily affordable housing complex with 17 master-metered accounts located in San Luis Obispo.

Background

A PG&E customer would like to install solar PV for a multifamily affordable housing complex in San Luis Obispo that has 17 master-metered accounts (and 17 service delivery points (SDP)). They would like to apply for PG&E's NEMVMASH tariff using a single billing arrangement. This project has received a conditional incentive reservation from the California Solar Initiative Multifamily Affordable Solar Housing (MASH) Program.

PG&E's NEMVMASH tariff allows low income MASH funded projects like this one to receive net energy metering under a single billing arrangement beyond a single SDP (subject to specific conditions relating to ownership and proximity). However, the NEMVMASH tariff only allows buildings to be on this tariff if the tenants are individually metered per Decision (D.) 08-10-036¹.

Given that this complex has 17 master-metered accounts and the tenants are not individually metered, this arrangement would not qualify for NEMVMASH. PG&E supports making this limited deviation to its NEMVMASH tariff to accommodate this customer's low income MASH project. Additionally, PG&E has previewed this request with the Energy Division and they have indicated that they would be receptive to a NEMVMASH tariff deviation for this low income project. PG&E does not believe this deviation would disadvantage any other customer and requests permission to proceed as described in more detail below.

Project Details

The 17 master metered installations that request to be treated as a single "MASH Eligible Low Income Development" (as defined in Schedule NEMVMASH) is for the Madonna Road Apartments, Incorporated, in San Luis Obispo, CA.²

Deviation Language

PG&E respectfully requests that the Commission grant the following NEMVMASH tariff deviations for this specific MASH funded project. PG&E seeks a deviation from:

- a) The language in the Applicability Section on Sheet 3 where it describes the Account Types – "Three types of Accounts in an Eligible Low Income Facility are covered by this tariff:
 - b. Common Area Account– each load-only Account for a common area, if any,..."

For the purposes of this deviation PG&E would add this language (italics):

b. Common Area Account– each load-only Account for a common area, if any, *plus, in the event that two or more master-metered accounts in a 'Eligible Low Income Development' (as defined in Schedule NEMVMASH) that receive MASH funding are permitted to take service under schedule NEMVMASH, all and for which the Owner is the PG&E Customer. For the purposes of allocating the credit, the NEMVMASH percentage allocation for each master-metered account must match the account's respective percentage allocation used to calculate the MASH incentives."*

- b) In the same section under c.:

c. Residential Unit Account – each load-only account for a residential unit located in the Eligible Low Income Facility, and for which an occupant is the PG&E Customer,.

For the purposes of this deviation PG&E would add this language (italics):

c. Residential Unit Account – each load-only account for a residential unit located in the Eligible Low Income Facility, and for which an occupant is the PG&E Customer, *except as described for master-metered accounts in b. above.*
