**Subject: Submits Notice of Construction, Pursuant to General Order 131-D, for the Construction of Tranquillity Switching Station and Solar Project Interconnection in the County of Fresno**

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (“PG&E” or “the Company”) hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct or Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity.

**Purpose**

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

**Background**

To interconnect the Tranquillity Solar Project to the electric transmission system, the solar project developer is proposing to construct a new approximately 6-acre 230 kilovolt (kV) switching station in Fresno County (larger project CEQA) and transfer its ownership to PG&E. The proposed solar facility is centered along State Route 33 (South Derrick Avenue) between West Manning Avenue and West Mountain View Avenue, approximately 11 miles west of the City of San Joaquin. Tranquillity Switching Station will be located within the proposed solar project boundaries, centered approximately 0.25 miles northwest of the intersection of South Ohio Avenue and West Dinuba Avenue. To interconnect the new switching station, PG&E will relocate and loop approximately 1,100 and 1,300 feet of the existing Helm-Panoche 230 kV and Kearney-Panoche 230 kV transmission lines, respectively, into and out of the switching station (minor relocation). To relocate the transmission lines, PG&E will install approximately eight tubular steel poles, 4 poles in-line with the existing Helm-Panoche 230 kV and Kearney-Panoche 230 kV transmission lines, and 4 poles south of the

existing lines adjacent to the switching station. The new poles will be approximately 80 to 105 feet tall, which is approximately the same height or shorter than the existing towers. PG&E will also remove two existing approximately 105-foot-tall lattice steel transmission towers. Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin in January 2015, or as soon as project plans and approvals are in place. Construction is scheduled to be completed in January 2016, or as soon as possible after construction begins.

CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III.A (transmission line relocations) and III.B.1 (switching station) exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. The Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption(s),

III.A: "the minor relocation of existing power line facilities"

III.B.f: "power lines or substations to be relocated or constructed which have undergone environmental review pursuant to CEQA as part of a larger project, and for which the final CEQA document (Environmental Impact Report (EIR) or Negative Declaration) finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts caused by the proposed line or substation."

The County of Fresno certified an EIR for the Tranquillity Solar Generating Facility Project on October 9, 2014 (State Clearinghouse #2013111056), which concluded there would be no significant unavoidable environmental impacts as a result of the PG&E interconnection facilities.

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

### **Protests**

- b. The cumulative impact of successive projects of the same type in the same place, over time, is significant; or
- c. There is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances.

Protests should include the following:

1. Your name, mailing address and daytime telephone number.
2. Reference to the CPUC Advice Letter Number and Project Name.
3. A clear description of the reason for the protest.
4. Whether you believe that evidentiary hearings are necessary to resolve factual disputes.
