ADVICE 2212-G

Public Utilities Commission of the State of California

Pacific Gas & Electric Company (PG&E) hereby submits for filing revisions to its gas tariffs. The affected tariff sheets are listed on the enclosed Attachment I.

The purpose of this filing is to revise Form 79-866--Gas Transmission Service Agreement (GTSA), to clarify assignment provisions in Section 7—Assignments. PG&E may assign its interest in the GTSA to a parent, affiliate or company succeeding to all or substantially all of its business properties and assets. The Customer may assign all or part of its interest in individual exhibits to the GTSA to another party who has executed a GTSA, as specified in Section 7. However, the Customer may not assign its interest in the GTSA itself, since the assignee must have its own GTSA with PG&E.

Although only GTSA Section 7 is being revised, PG&E is re-filing the entire GTSA with a revision date of February 2000. (GTSA Exhibits A through I are not included in this filing.) This filing will not affect any other rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

PG&E requests that this filing be approved on regular notice, **March 20, 2000**, which is 40 days after the date of this filing.
