Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) hereby submits for filing a new sample gas and electric form – Form 79-1049 -- AGREEMENT TO INSTALL APPLICANT REQUESTED COMMON SPECIAL FACILITIES, attached to this advice letter. The affected tariff sheets are listed on the enclosed Attachment I.

Purpose

The purpose of this request is to seek approval of a new agreement that will be used for the installation and collection of charges for "common" special facilities.

Background

PG&E's current Special Facilities Agreement (which will remain in effect) is appropriate for complex and expensive facilities such as generation interconnection facilities, distribution upgrades, and dedicated circuits that are likely to be reclassified and used as distribution facilities. This is a long-term agreement that remains in effect until terminated by either PG&E or the customer. Consequently, it is burdensome to administer over the term of the contract which can span as long as fifty years, especially when the premises change ownership without assigning the agreement. Currently, customers are billed for the additional installed cost of special facilities over standard facilities. The maintenance costs are collected through an Equivalent One-Time Payment (EOTP) which is the Cost of Ownership paid in perpetuity or a Monthly Cost of Ownership (MCOO). The MCOO covers the ongoing maintenance and ownership for the additional facilities. Also, customers are responsible for future costs associated with rearrangement or removal.

The majority of special facilities installed by PG&E are simple installations, such as residential and commercial distribution subsurface transformers, second

services, taller poles, and high pressure gas meters. These types of facilities are usually chosen and paid for by the owner to serve a limited number of customers and are rarely removed from service. PG&E believes that these types of facilities would be better served by a simplified, short-term agreement that provides for collection of a one-time non-refundable charge to cover installation and on-going cost of ownership. There will be no termination charge and, thus, no equitable adjustments in the event PG&E uses the facilities for other customers in the future. These changes eliminate the need for both PG&E and the customer to administer a long-term agreement, and there is no need to track down customers to collect removal or rearrangement charges after the premises change hands.


