Subject: Supplement to PG&E's ClimateSmart Program Marketing and Budget Plan Submitted in Compliance in Decision 06-12-032**Purpose**

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) hereby supplements its Advice 2832-G/3050-E, filed May 4, 2007, as a result of direction from the California Public Utilities Commission's (CPUC's) Energy Division. This supplement clarifies PG&E's compliance with CPUC Decision (D.) 06-12-032, which approved, with modifications, the Climate Protection Tariff (now titled 'ClimateSmart'). PG&E also takes this opportunity to make one typographical correction, as noted below, to Advice 2832-G/3050-E.

Additions to Advice 2832-G/3050-E

In this supplement, PG&E clarifies that the following attributes will be incorporated into the marketing plan for the ClimateSmart program:

- In compliance with Ordering Paragraph 24 of CPUC Decision (D.) 06-12-032, PG&E will use, to the maximum extent possible, recycled products for ClimateSmart marketing materials.
- In compliance with Ordering Paragraph 23 of D.06-12-032, PG&E will disclose in marketing materials for customer sign-up that the "time-frame of reductions does not match that of the emissions to be offset."
- In compliance with Ordering Paragraph 3 of D.06-12-032 and as stated on page 10 of Advice 2832-G/3050-E, PG&E will not shift funds from marketing to administration or vice versa, or from program year-to-year unless authorized by the CPUC. As stated, PG&E will continue to comply with the CPUC's order. Final, actual marketing expenses may differ (i.e. printing of marketing materials may be less costly than anticipated, etc.) and PG&E, in consultation with the External Advisory Group which includes CPUC staff, may alter spending based on the effectiveness of such spending (to be studied through market research). As stated on page 11 of Advice 2832-G/3050-E, any such revisions to the marketing plan will be communicated to the CPUC as part of the annual report.

Correction to Advice 2832-G/3050-E

In this supplement, PG&E also submits a substitute sheet to make a correction to an inadvertent typographical error on page 13 of Advice 2832-G/3050-E. In compliance with Ordering Paragraph 14 of D.06-12-032, annual reports regarding the ClimateSmart program are due March 15, 2008; March 15, 2009; and March 15, 2010.

Protests

Since this is a supplemental filing clarifying that PG&E will act in accordance with the CPUC's decision, PG&E requests an expedited protest period and review period pursuant to General Order 96-A, Section IV-B Effective Date and Section XV-Exceptions. 
