Subject: Changes to Electric and Gas Form 79-1049 Under the Provisions of
Electric and Gas Rule 2.

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) hereby submits for filing revisions to its gas and electric tariffs. The affected tariffs are listed on the enclosed Attachment I.

Purpose

The purpose of this advice letter is to add three lines on the billing table of Form 79-1049 - *Agreement to Install Applicant Requested Common Special Facilities*, in order to provide customers more information and increased clarity about costs and payments.

Background

PG&E accommodates requests by customers to install facilities that are in addition to or in substitution for standard facilities. PG&E uses Form 79-1049 to, among other things, inform customers about costs and payments associated with the installations. Currently the Form does not include a line for the payment of a Per Meter Charge (PMC) (per D. 04-05-055), a line for items not subject to the Income Tax Component of Contribution (ITCC), or a line to credit work provided by the Applicant.

First, a PMC is necessary when PG&E performs work under Rule 2 that requires a second meter. The second meter is assessed a PMC. The current form does not provide space for this charge.

Next, if a second service includes trenching on private property the ITCC is not applied to the trench. The current Form does not allow explicit recognition of this non-taxable item.

Finally, if an applicant performs his or her own work there is currently no way to acknowledge and credit back the value of this work. This advice letter proposes to add a line to credit the applicant for work performed.

Form Revisions

Pacific Gas and Electric proposes to add three lines to Form 79-1049, part 2:

- 1) Per Meter Charge in Compliance with D.04-05-055
- 2) Items not subject to ITCC
- 3) Credit for work provided by Applicant.



5. Where it is necessary to install Special Facilities on Applicant's premises, Applicant hereby grants to PG&E:
 - (a) the right to make such installation on Applicant's premises along the shortest practical route thereon and of sufficient width to provide legal clearance from all structures now or hereafter erected on Applicant's premises for any facilities of PG&E; and ,
 - (b) the right of ingress to and egress from Applicant's premises at all reasonable hours for any purposes reasonably connected with the operation and maintenance of the Special Facilities.
6. As provided in PG&E's applicable Electric Rule 14 or Gas Rules 14 and 21, Applicant understands that PG&E does not guarantee electric or gas service to be free from outages, interruptions, or curtailments and that the charges for the Special Facilities represent the additional cost associated with providing the Special Facilities rather than for a guaranteed level of service or reliability.
7. Upon request of the customer and at the option of PG&E, gas will be delivered at a pressure higher than standard delivery pressure where such higher pressure is available from existing facilities. PG&E, however, retains the right to decrease at any time the higher delivery pressure, as per Rule 2, incorporated into this agreement by reference.
