Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) hereby submits for filing revisions to its gas and electric tariff sheets. The affected tariff sheets are listed on the enclosed Attachment I.

This supplement supersedes Advice 2919-G/3246-E in its entirety.

Purpose

The purpose of this advice filing is to eliminate Form 79-865 - *Electric and Gas Monitoring Meter Pulse Agreement*, which has been superseded by Form 79-1049. In addition, PG&E also makes minor revisions to Form 79-1049 to clarify its terms and ensure completeness.

Background

Form 79-865 - *Electric and Gas Monitoring Meter Pulse Agreement*, was approved in Advice 2130-G/1837-E on May 19, 1999, to provide customers with access to their meter data by receiving meter data pulses from their gas and/or electric meters. PG&E is now using Form 79-1049 - *Agreement to Install Applicant Requested Common Special Facilities*, to provide customers with meter data pulse services. Form 79-1049 was approved in Advice 2688-G/2755-E on January 11, 2006, and later revised in Advice 2890-G/3167-E. This agreement is used for the installation and collection of charges for “common” (as opposed to “complex”) special facilities and can be used, as well, for the installation of electric and gas meter pulse devices. As a result, PG&E has discontinued the use of Form 79-865 in favor of the simpler special facilities agreement.

Tariff Revisions

Form 79-1049 has been modified to:

- Specifically state that PG&E will install common special facilities (including pulse meters) within a reasonable time;
- Explain more thoroughly the Equivalent One Time Cost of Ownership;
- Explain the Income Tax Component of Contribution (ITCC); and
- Clarify to which costs the ITCC applies.

PG&E has also added language at the end of the form making clear that this agreement is subject to modifications by the California Public Utilities Commission at all times.

Shortened Protest Period (11 Days)

PG&E is requesting a shortened protest period for this advice letter because there are minimal differences between this supplement and the original filing, which was not protested. Anyone wishing to protest this filing may do so by letter sent via U.S. mail, by facsimile or electronically, any of which must be received no later than **July 28, 2008**, which is 11 days after the date of this filing.
