Subject: April 1, 2012 Gas Core Procurement, Transportation, Residential Winter Gas Savings (WGSP) and Core Deaveraging Rate Changes and Gas Baseline Quantity Changes

Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E") hereby submits for filing revisions to its gas tariffs. The affected tariff sheets are included in Attachment I to this filing.

Purpose

The purpose of this filing is to submit changes to PG&E's core end-use customer gas rates effective **April 1, 2012**. Specifically, this filing:

1. Revises PG&E's gas procurement rates for core customers.
2. Revises PG&E's gas transportation rates to recover 2012 WGSP) costs from residential customers, as filed and approved in Advice Letter (AL) 3222-G.
3. Revises gas transportation rates by core deaveraging¹ rates by 5%, in compliance with PG&E's 2010 Biennial Cost Allocation (BCAP) Decision (D.) 10-06-035.
4. Revises PG&E's residential gas baseline quantities adopted in 2011 General Rate Case (GRC) Phase 2, D. 11-12-053 and rates as filed in AL 3281-G.

This filing is submitted in compliance with D. 97-10-065, which approved monthly changes for gas procurement rates for core customers. Consistent with

¹ Core deaveraging is the process that is used to move the Residential customer class rate closer to the actual cost of serving this customer class. The Commission previously authorized reductions in the subsidy of the residential customer class by the Small Commercial customer class.

D. 98-07-025, PG&E's core procurement rates changes are made effective no later than the fifth business day of the month.²

Procurement Rate Changes

PG&E is revising the gas procurement charges shown on core end-use customer Schedules G-1, G1-NGV, GM, GS, GT, GL-1, GL1-NGV, GML, GSL, GTL, G-NR1, G-NR2, G-NGV1, G-NGV2 and G-CP—*Gas Procurement Service to Core End-Use Customers*. The procurement charges shown on Schedule G-CP are for illustrative purposes only and are the same as those shown on the end-use customer schedules. The gas procurement rate varies by rate schedule due to the allocation of capacity charges and winter gas savings program costs to the core customer classes.

Schedule G-CP procurement charges proposed in this filing are shown below:

The Schedule G-CP rates effective **April 1, 2012**, reflect:

1. A monthly weighted average cost of gas ("WACOG") of \$0.22299 per therm, compared to last month's WACOG of \$0.26510 per therm;
2. A credit of \$0.00973 per therm to amortize over 1 month a \$1.7 million over-collection in the Core Sales subaccount of the Purchased Gas Account ("PGA") ;
3. A charge of \$0.00068 per therm to amortize over 1 month a \$122 thousand under-collection in the Core Shrinkage subaccount of the PGA;
4. A credit of \$0.00363 per therm to amortize over 1 month a \$653 thousand over-collection in the Core Firm Storage Account;
5. A credit of \$0.01129 per therm to amortize over 1 month a \$2.0 million over-collection in the Core Pipeline Demand Charge Account; and

6. A charge of \$0.03151 per therm for residential, a charge of \$0.01246 per therm for small commercial, and a charge of \$0.00730 per therm for large commercial customers to collect procurement-related marketing costs and program rebates associated with PG&E's 2011 WGSP³ and to continue amortization over twelve months of a \$15.7 million under-collection in the Winter Gas Savings subaccount of the PGA.

Recovery of 2012 WGSP Residential Transportation Costs

Consistent with implementation of PG&E's 2012 WGSP, as authorized in AL 3222-G⁴ and AL 3130-G-A⁵, the transportation rates in this filing include the forecasted residential portion of transportation-related marketing costs and program rebates totaling \$15.7 million are to be recovered in residential transportation rates between April and October 2012.

Core Deaveraging

PG&E's 2010 BCAP, D. 10-06-035, adopted that PG&E's remaining 30 percent core deaveraging shall be implemented by deaveraging rates by an initial increase of 5 percent upon adoption of D. 10-06-035, with additional 5 percent deaveraging on April 1st of each succeeding year until PG&E's core rates are fully deaveraged. In this advice letter, PG&E's core rates are modified so that the remaining 20percent core deaveraging is deaveraged by 5 percent, thus resulting in a 15 percent core deaveraging.

Baseline Quantity Changes

In accordance with PG&E's 2011 GRC Phase 2 D. 11-12-053, PG&E is revising its baseline quantities for PG&E's residential customers. PG&E's residential transportation rates in this filing reflect these revised baseline quantities. For further information, see also AL 3281-G⁶, filed February 29, 2012.
