Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E") hereby submits this supplemental advice filing to revise language in the Discussion section of Advice 3294-G.

Purpose

PG&E is submitting this supplemental advice filing to revise text on page 4 of Advice 3294-G in the Discussion section under the sub-heading "*Gas Form 79-845-D Core Firm Storage Declarations.*" Currently, the text states:

This Form is revised to correct the definition of a Core Transport Group to be consistent with other tariffs, specifically Gas Rule 1: Definitions; and correct typographical errors.

Instead, the text should say:

This Form is revised to correct the definition of a Core Transport Group to be consistent with other tariffs, specifically Gas Rule 1: Definitions, in order to correctly convey that Gas Form 79-845-D pertains to entities described in Gas Rule 1, Core Transport Group, rather than Core Procurement Group.

Protests

Advice Letter 3294-G was not protested. PG&E believes that this supplemental filing is merely clarifying in nature and therefore requests that, pursuant to Section 7.5.1 of General Order 96-B, the protest period not be re-opened.

Effective Date

PG&E requests that this Tier 3 supplemental advice filing, upon Energy Division approval, become effective concurrent with the requested effective date for Advice 3294-G, which is **May 29, 2012**.
