Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) hereby submits this advice letter to implement the Demand Response (DR) cost recovery directives in D.12-04-045, along with closing and deleting references to the ClimateSmart™ “Administration and Marketing Subaccounts (gas and electric) due to the termination of the program on December 31, 2011 per D.10-10-025, and updating the ClimateSmart™ Balancing Accounts Preliminary Statements (gas and electric) to reflect the continuance of the Premium Subaccount. The affected tariff sheets are listed on the enclosed Attachment 1.

Purpose

PG&E is filing a Tier 2 advice letter to revise *Electric Preliminary Statement Part CZ-Distribution Revenue Adjustment Mechanism (DRAM)* per D.12-04-045-*Decision Adopting Demand Response Activities and Budgets for 2012 through 2014*. The attached tariff revisions relate to the authorized closure of the *Air Conditioning Expenditures Balancing Account (ACEBA)* and the *Demand Response Revenue Balancing Account (DRRBA)*, in addition to the recording of revenues resulting from bidding PG&E’s DR programs into the California Independent System Operator (CAISO) market.

D.12-04-045 (pages 202-203), approved 1) the closing of the ACEBA and transferring costs formerly tracked in the ACEBA into the Demand Response Expenditures Balancing Account (DREBA), 2) closing the DRRBA and transferring costs recorded in that account to the DRAM, and 3) to allow for recording into the DRAM any revenues resulting from PG&E bidding DR programs into the CAISO market.

Concurrently, PG&E was authorized in D.10-10-025 to close the ClimateSmart™ Program on December 31, 2011. Advice 2958-G-A/3344-E-A dated November 9, 2011 notes the continuation of the ClimateSmart™ balancing accounts past the termination of the Program to record ongoing and committed expenses directed by the Commission in D.10-10-025. PG&E now proposes to close the “Administrative and Marketing Subaccount” of the *ClimateSmart™ Balancing Account-Gas Preliminary Statement Part BS (CSBA-G)* and the *ClimateSmart™ Balancing Account-Electric Preliminary Statement Part EM (CSBA-E)* to reflect the balance to be transferred to the ClimateSmart™ Charity (Charity) as of May 31, 2012, along with removing all references to this Subaccount in the DRAM, CSBA-G and CSBA-E Preliminary Statements. Resolution G-3429 dated December 15, 2011, retains the “Premium Subaccounts” (page 9) as the “Segregated Account” as defined in the Servicing Agreement executed on December 20, 2011 between PG&E and the Charity, to track contributions from PG&E to the Charity and any related billing adjustments.

- Under 5.m., deleting “ClimateSmart™ Administrative and Marketing” and inserting “Demand Response.”
- Adding a new credit entry 5.n., to record any revenues resulting from PG&E’s bidding DR programs into the CAISO market.
- Re-labeling the remaining items accordingly.

ACEBA – Electric Preliminary Statement Part EV

- Closing the Electric Preliminary Statement Part EV-Air Conditioning Expenditures Balancing Account (ACEBA)

DRRBA – Electric Preliminary Statement Part ED

- Closing the Electric Preliminary Statement Part ED-Demand Response Revenue Balancing Account (DRRBA)

CSBA-G/ Gas Preliminary Statement Part BS and CSBA-E/ Electric Preliminary Statement Part EM

- Delete sentences pertaining to the Administration and Marketing Subaccount in paragraphs 1, 2, and 3, along with deleting Section 4.b. (i. through v.) – Administration and Marketing Subaccount.
- Updating paragraph 2-APPLICABILITY to reflect the closure of the ClimateSmart™ Program to new customers on January 1, 2012 and the continuation of the Premium Subaccount (designated and defined as the Segregated Account in the Servicing Agreement under Resolution G-3429) for the purpose of any billing adjustments.

2. APPLICABILITY: The Premium Subaccount of the CSBA-G shall apply to all customers who were enrolled in the voluntary ClimateSmart program or persons who otherwise made ClimateSmart program donations that were recorded in this subaccount. The ClimateSmart Program closed to new customers on January 1, 2012. The Premium Subaccount (defined as the Segregated Account in the Servicing Agreement approved by Resolution G-3429) will remain open for the purpose of any billing adjustments in accordance with PG&E tariffs. 3. RATES: The gas ClimateSmart charge rate associated with the Premium Subaccount of the CSBA is \$0.06528 per therm, or as otherwise approved by the CPUC. The ClimateSmart Charge rate does not include an allowance for FF&U, which is not applicable, and the rate does not recover the balance in this subaccount. (D)

 - f. A debit or credit entry, as necessary, equal to the interest on the average of the balance at the beginning of the month and the balance for entries 4.a to 4.e above at a rate equal to one-twelfth the cost-of-capital rate adopted in PG&E's latest cost-of-capital proceeding. (T)
