**Subject: February 1, 2013 Gas Core Procurement and Transportation
Rate and Tariff Changes**

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (“PG&E”) hereby submits for filing, revisions to its gas tariffs. The affected tariff sheets are included in Attachment I to this filing.

Purpose

The purpose of this filing is to submit changes to PG&E’s core end-use customer gas rates effective **February 1, 2013**. Specifically, this filing revises PG&E’s gas procurement rates for core customers.

This filing is submitted in compliance with Decision (“D.”) 97-10-065, which approved monthly changes for gas procurement rates for core customers. Consistent with D. 98-07-025, PG&E’s core procurement rates changes are made effective no later than the fifth business day of the month.¹

In addition, this advice letter incorporates changes to core transportation rates consistent with those being submitted in PG&E’s Noncore Advice Letter 3360-G, also to be effective February 1, 2013.

Procurement Rate Changes

PG&E is revising the gas procurement charges shown on core end-use customer Schedules G-1, G1-NGV, GM, GS, GT, GL-1, GL1-NGV, GML, GSL, GTL, G-NR1, G-NR2, G-NGV1, G-NGV2 and G-CP—*Gas Procurement Service to Core End-Use Customers*. The procurement charges shown on Schedule G-CP are for illustrative purposes only and are the same as those shown on the end-use customer schedules. The gas procurement rate varies by rate schedule due to the allocation of capacity charges and winter gas savings program costs to the core customer classes.

The Schedule G-CP rates effective **February 1, 2013**, reflect:

1. A monthly weighted average cost of gas ("WACOG") of \$0.32521 per therm, compared to last month's WACOG of \$0.30149 per therm;
2. A charge of \$0.01378 per therm to amortize over 1 month a \$3.6 million under-collection in the Core Sales subaccount of the Purchased Gas Account ("PGA") ;
3. A credit of \$0.00056 per therm to amortize over 1 month a \$145 thousand over-collection in the Core Shrinkage subaccount of the PGA;
4. A credit of \$0.00217 per therm to amortize over 12 months a \$5.2 million over-collection in the Core Firm Storage Account;
5. A credit of \$0.00830 per therm to amortize over 12 months a \$19.8 million over-collection in the Core Pipeline Demand Charge Account;
6. A charge of \$0.01979 per therm recover costs associated with PG&E's 2012 Annual Hedge Plan, recorded in the Core Hedging Plan subaccount of the Purchased Gas Account; and
7. A credit of \$0.00114 per therm for residential, a charge of \$0.00661 per therm for small commercial, and a charge of \$0.00746 per therm for large commercial customers to collect procurement-related marketing costs and program rebates associated with PG&E's 2012 Winter Gas Savings Program ("WGSP")² and to begin amortization over twelve months of a \$2.4 million over-collection in the Winter Gas Savings subaccount of the PGA.

² Procurement-related marketing costs and program bill credits associated with PG&E's Winter Gas Savings Program are collected in April through October for residential customers and January through December for commercial customers.

Core Transportation Rate Changes

Pipeline Safety Implementation Plan

Decision (“D.”) 12-12-30, issued on December 20, 2012, authorizes PG&E to implement in rates a 2013 gas transportation revenue requirement increase of \$115.3 million to fund PG&E’s Pipeline Safety Implementation Plan. Of this total, \$69.5 million is allocated to core customer classes. The adopted total core Implementation Plan Rate for 2013 is \$0.02384 per therm (including Franchise Fees and Uncollectibles Expense). This total rate is comprised of subcomponents for local transmission, backbone transmission, and storage as shown on Preliminary Statement, Part B (attached). This new total rate component is included in the customer class charge portion of PG&E’s transportation rates. Advice Letter 3357-G implemented the preliminary statement changes (other than Preliminary Statement, Part B) authorized in D.12-12-030.

Air Resources Board AB32 Cost of Implementation Fee

D.12-10-044 authorizes PG&E to recover, in gas transportation rates, the AB32 Administration Fees billed to PG&E by the Air Resources Board (“ARB”). PG&E filed Advice Letter 3348-G on December 7, 2012, proposing ratemaking treatment for recovery of these fees through an Air Resources Board AB32 Cost of Implementation (ARB AB32 COI) rate component. The Commission approved Advice Letter 3348-G, on January 24, 2013.

This Advice Letter implements PG&E’s authorized ARB AB 32 COI recovery in rates. The total ARB AB32 COI revenue requirement included in February 1, 2013 rates is \$15.4 million. This amount reflects invoices received from ARB for emission periods beginning in 2008 and ending in 2010. Of this total, the allocation to core customer classes is \$8.9 million. The ARB AB32 COI rate component (including Franchise Fees and Uncollectibles Expense) is \$0.00309 per therm for all applicable volumes. This new rate component is included in the customer class charge portion of PG&E’s transportation rates.

Core transportation rates included in this advice letter incorporate these changes.

Preliminary Statement Changes

Preliminary Statement Part B – Default Tariff Rate Components, is revised to reflect changes to core transportation and procurement rates filed herein.

Effective Date

In accordance with D. 97-10-065 and D. 98-07-025, PG&E requests that this **Tier 1** advice filing be approved effective **February 1, 2013**.
