1. TERRITORY SERVED BY PG&E

- a. The Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) supplies gas service in all or portions of 37 counties in the northern and central part of the State of California. The territory in which each rate schedule is applicable is described on the schedule.
- b. The baseline territories used in the residential rate schedules are shown below for each county. Specific boundaries may be drawn to avoid dividing communities or neighborhoods.

c. DESCRIPTION OF BASELINE TERRITORIES CITED IN b. ABOVE:

1) ALAMEDA COUNTY (S and T portions)

(S) The Central Valley portion east of Altamont Pass.

(T) That westerly part of Alameda County bounded on the west and north by the Alameda County line where it is contiguous with the City and County of San Francisco and Contra Costa County, on the east by the westerly boundaries of Contra Costa County, Redwood Regional Park, Joaquin Miller Park and Anthony Chabot Regional Park, and on the south by southerly boundary of the City of Oakland.

2) CONTRA COSTA COUNTY (S and T portions)

(S) The Central Valley portion and the Delta portion east of Port Chicago.

(T) That westerly part of Contra Costa County, bounded on the north by the northerly city limits of the City of Pinole; bounded at the east by a line running from the most easterly point of the city limits of the City of Pinole as of July 1, 1980 to the point on the county line common to Contra Costa and Alameda Counties about one-fourth of a mile east of the intersection of Grizzly Peak Boulevard and Wildcat Canyon Road (near the unincorporated community of Kensington); and bounded on the south and west by the county line of Contra Costa County.

3) HUMBOLDT COUNTY (V portion)

(V) Beginning at a point on the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean at its intersection with the north line of T12N, R1E, HB&M; then eastward to the NE corner of T12N, R2E; then southerly along the easterly line of said township and continuing along the easterly line of R2E to the SE corner of T2N, R2E; then westerly to the SW corner of said T2N, R2E; then in a straight line southwesterly to the SE corner of T1N, R1W; then westerly to the SW corner of T1N, R1W; then southerly to the NW corner of T3S, R1W; then southeasterly to the NE corner of T5S, R2E; then due south to the southerly boundary of Humboldt County; then westerly along said county line to the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean; then northerly along said shoreline to the point of beginning.

4) MARIN COUNTY (T portion)

(T) Beginning at a point on the northerly boundary of Marin County at the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean; then easterly along said county line to the intersection of said county line with the E line of T6N, R10W, MDB&M; then southerly in a straight line to the summit of Black Mountain; then southerly in a straight line to the summit of Barnabe Mountain; then due south in a straight line to the point of intersection with a line drawn due west from the summit of Pine Mountain; then due east to the summit of Pine Mountain; then southeasterly to the East Peak of Mt. Tamalpais; then in a straight line easterly to the summit of Knob Hill which is on

4) MARIN COUNTY (T portion) (Cont'd.)

Blithedale Ridge: then southerly along said Ridge to the city limits of the City of Larkspur; then southerly and easterly along said city limits to the town limits of the Town of Corte Madera, then along the southerly town limits of Corte Madera to the westerly line of the right of way of the Northwestern Pacific Railroad (Tiburon Line); then due east across said right of way to the town limits of Corte Madera; then southerly and easterly along said town limits to the shoreline of San Francisco Bay; then southerly, westerly, and northerly along said shoreline to the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean; then northerly along said shoreline to the point of beginning.

5) MENDOCINO COUNTY (T portion)

(T) Beginning at a point on the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean at the northerly boundary of Mendocino County; then easterly to the easterly line of T5S, R2E, HB&M; then southerly along said easterly line to a point on the north line of T24N, R18W, MDB&M; then in a straight line southeasterly to the NW corner of T23N, R17W; then in a straight line southerly to the NE corner of T21N, R17W; then south along the easterly line of R17W to the SW corner of T16N, R16W; then in a straight line southerly to the NW corner of T13N, R15W; then south to the SW corner of said T13N, R15W; then southeasterly to the SE corner of T12N, R15W; then south along the easterly line of T11N, R15W to the southerly boundary of Mendocino County; then westerly along said county line to the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean; then northerly along said shoreline to the point of beginning.

6) MONTEREY COUNTY (T portion)

(T) Beginning at a point on the shoreline of Monterey Bay at its intersection with the northerly boundary of Monterey County; then easterly along said boundary to the NW corner of San Benito County; then southerly along the easterly boundary of Monterey County to Fremont Peak; then in a straight line southerly to Blue Rock Mountain; then in a straight line southwesterly to the summit of Palo Corona, south of the Town of Carmel-by-the-Sea; then in a straight line southeasterly to Cone Peak; then in a straight line southeasterly to a point on the southerly boundary of Monterey County at its intersection with the NE corner of T25S, R6E, MDB&M; then westerly along said boundary to the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean; then northerly and easterly, along the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean to the shoreline of Monterey Bay; then southerly, easterly and northerly along the shoreline of Monterey Bay to the point of beginning.

7) SAN BENITO COUNTY (T portion)

(T) That northwesterly part of San Benito County which lies within the area bounded by the centerlines of the Pajaro River, Highway 101 and the easterly boundary of Monterey County.

8) SAN LUIS OBISPO COUNTY (R and T portions)

(R) The San Joaquin Division portions.

(T) Beginning at a point on the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean at the northerly boundary of San Luis Obispo County; then easterly along said boundary to its intersection with the NE corner of T25S, R7E, MDB&M; then in a straight line southeasterly to the NE corner of T30S, R12E; then southeasterly in a straight line to the point where the east line of T11N, R33W, SBB&M, intersects the San Luis Obispo County line (centerline of Cuyama River, upstream from Twitchell Reservoir); then southerly and westerly along said county line to the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean; then northerly along said shoreline to the point of beginning.

9) SAN MATEO COUNTY (Q and T portions)

Beginning at a point at the intersection of the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean and the northerly boundary of San Mateo County; then easterly along said county line to the shoreline of San Francisco Bay; then southerly along said shoreline to a point on the northerly boundary of San Francisco International Airport; then westerly to the centerline of Highway 101; then southerly to the centerline of Interstate 380; then westerly to the centerline of Interstate 280; then southerly along said centerline to the Skyline Boulevard exit south of Interstate 280; then southerly along said centerline to the Skyline Boulevard exit south of Crystal Springs Road in the City of San Mateo; then southerly, westerly and southerly along the centerline of Skyline Boulevard (but including residences on the east side that front on Skyline Boulevard) to a point on the southern boundary of San Mateo County; then westerly along said county line to the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean; then northerly along said shoreline to the point of beginning.

(Q) The area within the above boundaries at or above 1,500' elevation.

(T) The area within the above boundaries and below 1,500' elevation.

10) SANTA CLARA COUNTY (Q portion)

(Q) That westerly portion of Santa Clara County fronting on and served from distribution facilities along Skyline Boulevard, Summit Road and Loma Prieta Road.

11) SOLANO COUNTY (X portion)

(X) The North Bay Division portion.

12) SONOMA COUNTY (T portion)

(T) Beginning at a point on the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean at its intersection with the northerly boundary of Sonoma County; then easterly along said county line to the easterly line of T11N, R15W, MDB&M; then in a straight line easterly to the SE corner of T11N, R14W; then in a straight line southeasterly to the SW corner of T8N, R11W; then continuing southeasterly to the SE corner of T7N, R10W; then southeasterly to the intersection of the E line of T6N, R10W with the southerly boundary of Sonoma County; then westerly along said county line to the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean; then northerly along said shoreline to the point of beginning.

d. FRESNO SERVICE AREA: The territorial boundary in Fresno County between Pacific Gas and Electric Company and Southern California Gas Company is described in an agreement between said companies revised January 4, 1956, and filed with Advice No. 279-G.

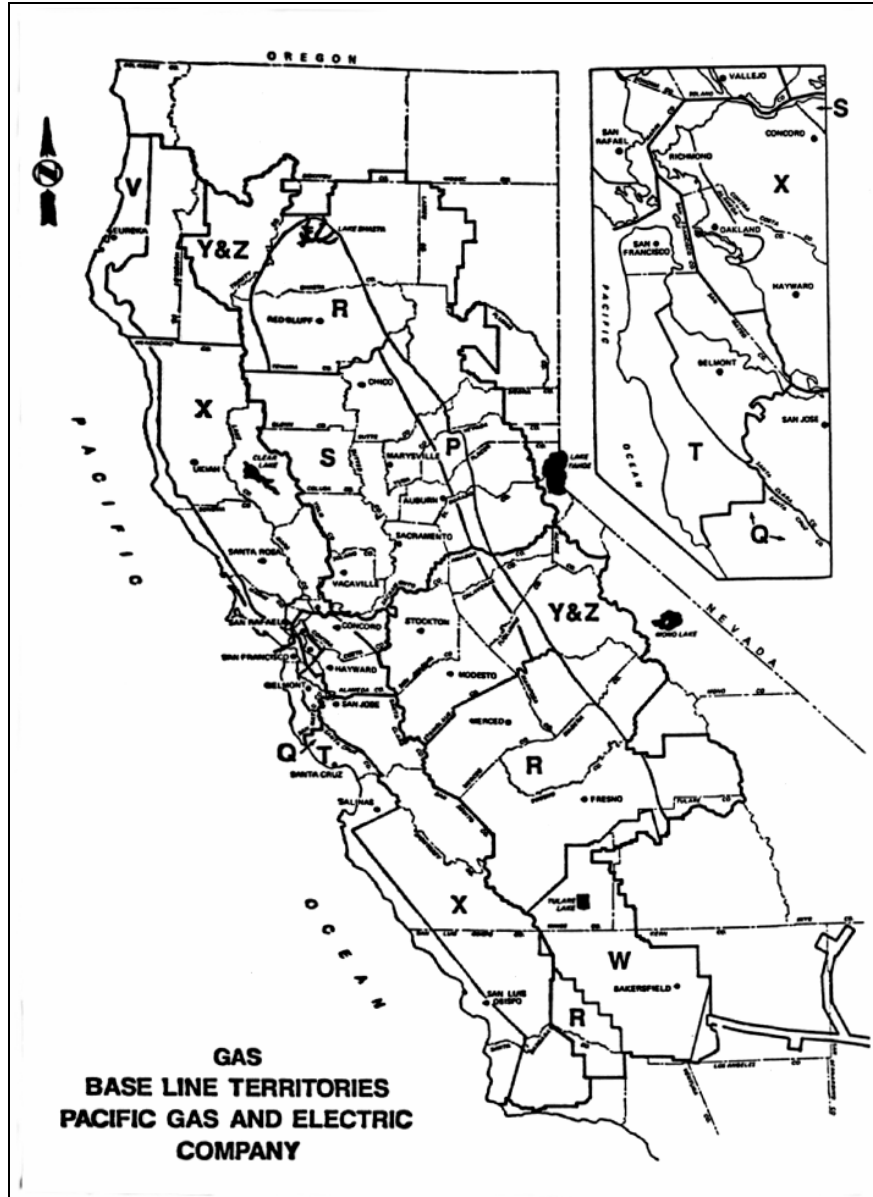

2. DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE

Detailed description of service is provided in Rule 2.

3. PROCEDURE TO OBTAIN SERVICE

Any person or corporation whose premises are adjacent to PG&E's distribution mains can obtain gas service from PG&E by making application in accordance with Rule 3, and, if required, by signing a contract in accordance with Rule 4. Applicants for service must conform to and comply with the applicable PG&E filed tariff schedules. Where an extension of PG&E's main or service piping is necessary or a substantial investment is required to supply service, the applicant will, upon application to PG&E, be informed as to the conditions under which service will be supplied.

4. ESTABLISHMENT OF CREDIT AND DEPOSITS

After making proper application for gas service, the applicant must establish credit with PG&E in accordance with Rule 6.

When credit is established by making a cash deposit, such deposit shall be made in accordance with Rule 7.

5. SAMPLE FORMS

Sample copies of printed forms that are normally used in connection with customers' services such as applications for service, regular bills for service, contract forms, delinquency notices, disconnect notices, deposit receipts, and similar forms are considered a part of PG&E's tariffs schedules.

From time-to-time PG&E may prepare sample forms using automated procedures. Such documents may have a standardized appearance that differs from the originally-filed form; however, the form will contain the precise terms and conditions of the original on file with and approved by the Commission. These documents shall be identified with the footnote; "Automated Document, Preliminary Statement, Part A."

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A. DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE AREA AND GENERAL REQUIREMENTS (Cont'd.)

6. GENERAL

- a. MEASUREMENT OF GAS: All gas as supplied by PG&E to its customers shall be measured by means of gas meters except as may otherwise be provided in PG&E's tariffs. If the installation of a gas meter is impractical, usage will be estimated from load and operating data.
- b. DISCOUNTS: All rates hereinafter listed are net rates and are not subject to discount, unless specifically stated on the schedule.
- c. DISCOUNTS FOR ADVANCES BY CUSTOMERS: Unless otherwise specified in PG&E's tariffs, no discounts in rates are allowed in consideration of customers advancing funds. (T)

- d. STANDARD RIDERS: No standard riders are used by PG&E.

7. SYMBOLS

When any change is proposed on any tariff schedule, attention shall be directed to such change by an appropriate character along the right-hand margin of the official copies filed with the Commission, utilizing the following symbols:

- (C) To signify changed listing, rule, or condition which may affect rates or charges;
- (D) To signify discontinued material, including listing, rate, rule or condition;
- (I) To signify increase;
- (L) To signify material relocated from or to another part of tariff schedules with no change in text, rate, rule or condition;
- (N) To signify new material including listing, rate, rule or condition;
- (R) To signify reduction; and
- (T) To signify change in wording of text but no change in rate, rule or condition.
