Here in East Clovis in Central Fresno, we're on a two-phase, multi-year project where we are bringing 24 megawatts here to our community.

We are doing a major upgrade and an expansion, bringing new capacity out to East Clovis, Southeast Clovis for all the expanded growth out here. There's a lot of new residential, new commercial space, new retail space, and a new high school going in out here. This job is quite large. We have a lot of underground work that's going through.

And we cross through three different jurisdictions. We are in the city of Fresno. We're in Fresno County. We're in the city of Clovis.

We're doing this project in two phases. The first phase will be completed before summer of 2026, and the second phase by the summer of 2028.

Investing in energy infrastructure, it's going to create jobs for this area. By stimulating the economic growth, it's going to foster further investments in Clovis. That's really important for the Clovis economy and its people and its community. By building these capacity projects, we can allow more people to connect to the grid, which will bring the cost down for everyone, as that is a shared cost.

We want our customers to know that the money they pay towards their bill, we are reinvesting it back into our communities to build safe, reliable, affordable, climate-resilient grid, and doing so at the lowest cost possible.
