Invitation for Public Comments

Remedial Action Plan for East Harbor Marina and

Outside East Harbor, San Francisco, California

May 2026

Introduction

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region (Water Board) is announcing a 30-day public comment period for the Remedial Action Plan (RAP) for the East Harbor Marina (East Harbor) and the area north of the East Harbor referred to as the Outside East Harbor (collectively, Sites). The Sites are located between the West Harbor Marina and Pier 1 of Fort Mason in San Francisco. The public comment period is from **May 15, 2026**, to **June 15, 2026**. Site History and Background

East Harbor is owned and operated by the San Francisco Recreation and Parks Department (RPD), and is located on San Francisco's northern waterfront, encompassing a marina and adjacent park with sidewalks, green space and public parking. Management of Outside East Harbor belongs to several entities.

In the late 1800s and early 1900s, PG&E and its predecessors owned and operated both the North Beach Manufactured Gas Plant (MGP), which occupied a portion of East Harbor, and the Fillmore MGP, which was located southwest of East Harbor. Subsequent environmental investigations of sediments at the Sites identified polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons related to historical operations of both former MGPs.

In March 2023, PG&E and RPD submitted two Draft Feasibility Study (FS) documents to the Water Board for the Sites. Both documents were presented to the public for review. Responses to public comments were provided by the Water Board and both FS documents were submitted as final in June 2025.

Remediation Action Plan Overview

The RAP was developed pursuant to requirements under Water Code Section 13267 and submitted by PG&E to the Water Board in December 2025. The RAP presents the cleanup plan for the Sites based on the preferred alternatives recommended in the FS documents. Cleanup activities are part of the San Francisco Marina Improvement and Remediation Project, a joint project between PG&E and RPD, to improve public access and park amenities in conjunction with remediating the Sites.

The primary components of the RAP design and implementation are:

- Dredging impacted sediment at the Sites
- Transporting dredged sediment to a Water Board-approved beneficial reuse or disposal facility
- Placing capping material to chemically and physically isolate deeper impacted sediment
- Installing a permeable reactive barrier along the East Harbor Marina shoreline to treat groundwater flowing into the Bay
- Establishing a monitoring program and institutional controls to preserve the integrity of the remedy from erosion, future dredging, or other activities that could disturb the remedy.

Project Status

PG&E submitted the RAP presenting the final remedy decisions to the Water Board on December 12, 2025, and revised it on April 29, 2026, based on Water Board comments. After public comments on the RAP are addressed, the Water Board anticipates PG&E to finalize the RAP in late 2026. Cleanup work is planned to take place over two years (2027-2028).
