Diablo Canyon Decommissioning Engagement Panel in Cooperation with PG&E Will Host a Public Meeting to Discuss the County of San Luis Obispo's Draft Environmental Impact Report on Decommissioning Diablo Canyon Power Plant

San Luis Obispo, Calif. – The Diablo Canyon Decommissioning Engagement Panel (Panel) and Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) will hold an in-person and virtual meeting **Wednesday, August 9, from 6:00pm-8:00pm** (PT). The meeting is being held to discuss the County of San Luis Obispo's recently released Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR) on decommissioning related activities at Diablo Canyon Power Plant (DCPP).

The meeting will include presentations from the County of San Luis Obispo, State Lands Commission and California Coastal Commission and information on how the public can participate in the DEIR process.

Additionally, an open house will be held from 4-6pm and 8-9pm, before and following the meeting, so members of the public and media may ask questions of representatives from presenting agencies and PG&E.

"PG&E is committed to safely and responsibly decommissioning DCPP in a manner that is respectful of the environment, reflects local community input and meets all regulatory requirements. While we are pursuing extended operations according to California Senate Bill 846, we are also diligently planning for the eventual decommissioning of DCPP," Maureen Zawalick, DCPP vice president, said.

The in-person meeting will be held at the San Luis Obispo County Government Center at 1055 Monterey Street in San Luis Obispo. About the Panel:

The Diablo Canyon Decommissioning Engagement Panel was created to foster open and frequent dialogue between members of the local community and PG&E on matters related to DCPP decommissioning. Panelists are local community members from across San Luis Obispo County who were selected to broadly represent diverse community viewpoints. The Panel meets periodically on matters related to DCPP decommissioning and the future use of DCPP lands and facilities.
