EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2026

PG&E electric rates are decreasing January 1, 2026

Throughout the year, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) submits requests to the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to change our rates. On December 30, 2025, PG&E submitted Advice Letter 7797-E to decrease bundled electric rates on January 1, 2026.

Estimated electric bill impacts effective January 1, 2026¹

A bundled customer is one who receives both their electric delivery and electric generation from PG&E. Average residential monthly bill impacts for a typical bundled customer are shown below:

	Previous As of 9/1/25	Decrease (\$)	Decrease (%)	Current As of 1/1/26
Average Non-CARE residential electric bill (500 kilowatt-hours)	\$219.72	-\$11.03	-5.0%	\$208.68
Average CARE residential electric bill (500 kilowatt-hours)	\$135.62	-\$7.83	-5.8%	\$127.79

Including the impact of the California Climate Credit²

Average Non-CARE residential electric bill (500 kilowatt-hours)	\$210.01	-\$7.36	-3.5%	\$202.65
Average CARE residential electric bill (500 kilowatt-hours)	\$125.91	-\$4.16	-3.3%	\$121.76

Customers enrolled in the CARE program receive a discount of approximately 38% on their electric bill.

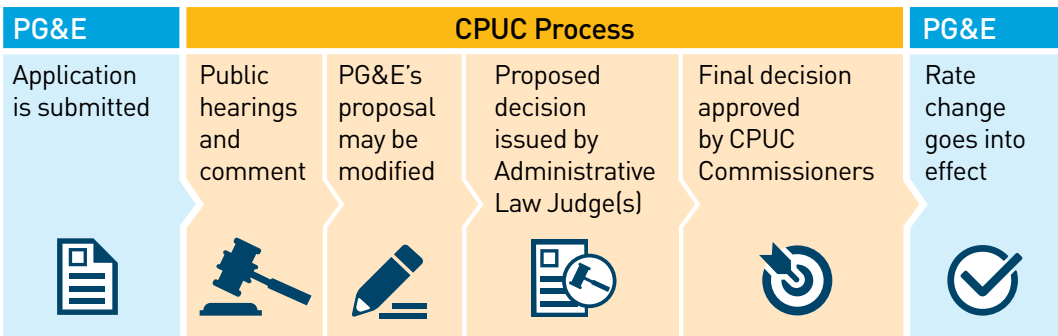
Why are rates decreasing?

The primary drivers of the January 1, 2026, decrease are as follows:

- Approved changes in PG&E’s 2026 Energy Resource and Recovery Account Forecast proceeding.
- Offsets other changes to PG&E’s delivery rates on January 1, resulting in a net decrease for PG&E’s bundled electric rates.

How are rates set?

Rates are set through a regulatory process with the CPUC. The process includes opportunities for the public to attend hearings and/or provide comments. A simplified diagram of the process is shown below.
