

Electric Rate Advisory EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1, 2025

Important update about electric rates

Throughout the year, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) submits requests to the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to change our rates. On August 27, 2025, PG&E submitted Advice Letter 7684-E to decrease rates on September 1, 2025.

PREVIOUS Residential Bundled Non-CARE Average Rate as of March 1, 2025: 45.33 cents per kilowatt-hour.

NEW Residential Bundled Non-CARE Average Rate as of **September 1, 2025**: 44.36 cents per kilowatt-hour.

Customers enrolled in the CARE program receive a discount of approximately 38% on their electric bill.

Why are rates decreasing?

The primary drivers of the September 1, 2025, decrease are as follows:

Both the non-Vegetation Management Balancing Account (VMBA) portion of the 2021 Wildfire Mitigation Catastrophic Event (WMCE) proceeding and the Intermittent Rate Relief (IRR) portion of the Wildfire Gas and Safety Costs (WGSC) have been fully recovered and are no longer included in current rates.

How are rates set?

Rates are set through a regulatory process with the CPUC. The process includes opportunities for the public to attend hearings and/or provide comments. A simplified diagram of the process is shown below.
