Important update about gas rates

Throughout the year, Pacific Gas and Electric Co. (PG&E) submits requests to the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to change our rates. On July 25, 2025, PG&E submitted Advice Letter 5090-G¹ updating gas rates effective August 1, 2025. PG&E's bundled residential average gas CARE and Non-CARE rates will decrease by approximately \$0.001, representing a 0.05% decrease for the typical CARE and Non-CARE bundled residential customer².

Customers enrolled in the CARE program receive a discount of approximately 20% on their gas bill.


Why are rates decreasing?

The primary drivers for the August 1, 2025, rate decrease are:

- End of recovery of the 2020 Wildfire Mitigation and Catastrophic Event (WMCE) Revenue Requirement per D.23-02-017. On February 2, 2023, the CPUC approved a settlement agreement to recover the 2020 WMCE revenue requirement over 2 years which began on August 1, 2023. Advice Letter 5090-G ends the recovery of the 2020 WMCE.
- An update to the 2025 PG&E pension revenue requirement as authorized in Advice Letter 5042-G.

How are rates set?

Rates are set through a regulatory process with the CPUC. The process includes opportunities for the public to attend hearings and/or provide comment. A simplified diagram of the process is shown below.
