

## **Community Wildfire Safety Program**

### **PG&E Wildfire Safety Webinar – San Joaquin, Tuolumne, Mariposa and Madera Counties – Post-Event Report**

On June 5, PG&E held a Wildfire Safety Webinar for customers in San Joaquin, Tuolumne, Mariposa and Madera Counties, in accordance with the Settlement Agreement approved by the May 7, 2020, California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) Decision (D.) 20-05-019 Order Instituting Investigation (OI) regarding the 2017 and 2018 wildfires.

PG&E is listening to customer feedback to help understand how we can continue to improve wildfire prevention efforts, including situational awareness and undergrounding efforts. The purpose of the event was to share safety and prevention activities, utility service-related information and customer resources, gather input and respond to questions.

The event featured a 60-minute presentation on the implementation of PG&E's Community Wildfire Safety Program in San Joaquin, Tuolumne, Mariposa and Madera Counties with multiple Q&A sessions. The presentation focused on PG&E's layers of protection, wildfire risk, situational awareness, undergrounding, infrastructure projects, safety tips and customer resources. Participants could either join via the virtual conference platform or by calling into a toll-free number. Closed captioning was available in English, Spanish and Chinese.

#### Event Outreach

PG&E conducted outreach through a variety of channels to drive attendance to the event. Outreach included:

- Email invitations sent to all electric customers in the counties
- Social media postings on Instagram, Facebook and Nextdoor
- News release and media advisory
- Outreach to city, county and tribal officials as well as through a variety of additional channels

#### Question and Answer Session Summary

- Wildfire mitigation and preparedness




