

## **Wildfire Safety Open House**

### **Wildfire Safety Open House – Redwood Valley Region Summary**

On July 1, 2025, PG&E held a Wildfire Safety Open House for customers in Redwood Valley, in accordance with the Settlement Agreement approved by the May 7, 2020, California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) Decision (D.) 20-05-019 Order Instituting Investigation (OII) regarding the 2017 and 2018 wildfires.

The purpose of PG&E's quarterly Wildfire Safety Open House is to share the progress made on the company's approach to the Community Wildfire Safety Program. The utility invited customers to meet with the regional leadership teams, including the Regional Vice President and subject matter experts. Company representatives provided updates on local projects and wildfire mitigation efforts, provided safety and preparedness tips, listened to customer feedback and answered questions.
