

# SANTA CRUZ FORMER MANUFACTURED GAS PLANT

Environmental Restoration Project | Project Summary - Fall 2012

Chevron Environmental Management Company (Chevron) and Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) will begin voluntary restoration work to clean up soil around a former manufactured gas plant at the properties located at 2035 N. Pacific Avenue and 201/211/223/235 River Street, Santa Cruz. The project will be overseen by the California EPA Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC)

The project involves excavation work to remove areas of contaminated soil and the removal of existing trees and landscaping in the areas of the excavations, as deemed necessary by the project arborist and approved by the City of Santa Cruz. The project is scheduled for August – January 2013.

Twenty to twenty-five replacement trees and drought tolerant, water-wise plants will be planted along the perimeter and interior areas of the properties. New landscaping that promotes public safety and blends in with downtown architecture will be constructed as part of this ecologically sensitive project.
