



# Self Generation Incentive Program

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ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT  
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The Self-Generation Incentive Program is part of Pacific Gas and Electric Company's (PG&E) extensive portfolio of energy management options designed to reduce the demand for natural gas and electricity and ensure reliable supplies for California while providing customers with options to directly control their energy use and carbon footprint.

grid (not back-up generation) and meet other criteria established by the California Public Utilities Commission. The program is designed primarily for business and large institutional customers.

PG&E's Self-Generation Incentive Program provides financial incentives to customers who install certain kinds and sizes of "clean" and renewable on-site distributed generation up to 5 megawatts. These facilities must be certified to operate in parallel with the electric system

Program participants are eligible to receive incentives for installing self-generation technologies based on system size, fuel source and projected cost. (Solar installations are not covered by PG&E's Self-Generation Program. Incentives for solar installations, however, are included in PG&E's California Solar Initiative.)
