



WORK NOTICE



Former Watsonville-1 Manufactured Gas Plant
618 Main Street
Watsonville, California

Field Work scheduled mid-February 2012 through May 2012

The California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) is distributing this work notice to let area residents and businesses know that PG&E will begin cleanup work in the parking lot area of 618 Main Street in Watsonville. The work includes removal of shallow soils that contain old gas plant residues such as polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs) and re-paving the parking lot.

Work Planned

The entire cleanup project is expected to last about ten weeks. Work will take place between the hours of 7:00 am and 5:00 pm Monday through Friday. Work planned for the site:

- Preliminary work to ready the site including an underground utility survey to locate underground piping and structures;
- About 300 cubic yards of soil and asphalt (approximately 25 truckloads) will be excavated and removed from the site. Excavated areas will be backfilled with clean soil, a newly paved parking lot (cap) will be constructed and the planter areas will be re-landscaped.
- Measures to protect the community will be used throughout the entire project including: installation of sound walls to lessen construction noise, on-site and fence line dust monitoring, wetting soils to suppress dust, excavating only small areas at a time for easy management, covering soil piles, and other techniques.
