



WORK NOTICE/PROJECT UPDATE

PG&E Former Manufactured Gas Plant
811 West J Street
Oakdale, California



Off-Site Work Scheduled – December 19 – 20, 2011

The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) is distributing this notice to inform the community about upcoming fieldwork in the vicinity of Pacific Gas and Electric Company's (PG&E) Oakdale Service Center (site) located at 811 West J Street in Oakdale, California. From 1913 to 1930, a manufactured gas plant operated on the site. During the past two years, PG&E's contractors have collected soil, soil gas, and groundwater samples from various locations on- and off-site; sample results show that residues from past gas manufacturing operations are present at the site, beneath West J Street, and in the southwest corner of the Oakdale High School athletic field and track just north of West J Street.

For the upcoming field work, PG&E contractors, under the oversight of DTSC and with authorization from the Oakdale Unified School District, will be applying chip seal over the exposed dirt areas in the southwest corner of the Oakdale High School. This covering will prevent contact with soil in this area which contains very low levels of old gas plant residues. In spring 2012, PG&E will return and excavate soils in this area, backfill the excavation with clean fill, and restore the area with a concrete cover.

Application of the chip seal will take place on Monday and Tuesday, December 19 – 20, 2011 between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. There should be no off-site impacts from this work.
