



Pacific Gas and Electric Company Manufactured Gas Plant (MGP) Program

Work Notice

280-290 Pismo Street, San Luis Obispo

July 6 - August 28, 2015

Introduction

From July 6 to August 28, Pacific Gas & Electric Company (PG&E) will be conducting field work at 280-290 Pismo Street and 1390 Walker Street in San Luis Obispo (site). This work is being conducted voluntarily with oversight provided by the California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) and will provide information for the design, planning and permitting of site cleanup activities. Cleanup is anticipated to begin in 2016 and is an important step in preparing the property for future redevelopment.

What work is planned?

Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday and includes:

- Drilling borings (holes) using a truck-mounted drill rig to collect soil samples
- Digging ten trenches to observe subsurface conditions and collect soil samples
- Cataloging samples for laboratory analysis
- Backfilling holes and trenches and general cleanup of work areas

All soil samples collected will be analyzed for chemicals associated with the historic gas-making process and trenching work will confirm the location of underground conditions and features. Information gathered will be used to design a plan to clean up soil contaminated from historic gas-making activities.

What measures will be taken to protect the community during this work?

Project work will be overseen by DTSC and conducted in accordance with a site-specific Health and Safety Plan and city and county of San Luis Obispo permits. Measures will be implemented during the work to minimize potential dust, noise and other impacts on the surrounding community. A health and safety meeting will be held at the beginning and end of each work day and an environmental project manager will oversee all work in the field. Air monitoring will be conducted during the trenching activities to make sure that levels of chemicals in the air are well below levels designed to protect the health and safety of onsite workers and nearby populations.
