## **ADVICE 1961-E**

Public Utilities Commission of the State of California.

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) hereby reports to the Commission the gain on sale realized from the sale of various streetlight systems. This filing is made in compliance with Decision (D.) 99-03-047, D. 99-06-015, and D. 99-06-086.

In Application (A.) 98-11-014, filed November 5, 1998, PG&E and the Cities of Clearlake, Fortuna, Marysville, and McKinleyville requested, under Public Utilities Code § 851, to sell and convey PG&E's streetlight systems located in the respective cities. D. 99-03-047, dated March 18, 1999, approved that request.

Additionally, in A. 99-02-031, filed February 22, 1999, PG&E and the Cities of Monterey, Morgan Hill, and Watsonville requested, under Public Utilities Code § 851, to sell and convey PG&E's streetlight systems located in the respective cities. D. 99-06-015, dated June 3, 1999, approved that request.

Finally, in A. 99-04-002, filed April 5, 1999, PG&E and the City of Gilroy requested, under Public Utilities Code § 851, to sell and convey PG&E's streetlight system located in the City of Gilroy. D. 99-06-086, dated June 24, 1999, approved that request.

Ordering Paragraphs 3 of Decisions 99-03-047, 99-06-015, and 99-06-086 require PG&E to inform the Commission by advice letter the gain on sale realized from the sales of those streetlight systems. Attachment I contains the gain on sale for each of the streetlight systems.<sup>1</sup> As authorized by Decisions 99-03-047, 99-06-015, and 99-06-086, the gains will accrue to PG&E's shareholders.

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any rate schedule or rule.

PG&E requests that this filing become effective on **January 20, 2000**, which is the date of filing.

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<sup>1</sup> Although D. 99-03-047 approved the sales for all four cities, the City of Clearlake chose not to purchase the streetlight system in that city.
