Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E" or "the Company") hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

Purpose

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

Background

PG&E proposes to replace existing wires (conductors) with new wires (reconductor) on approximately 7 miles of the Haas-Woodchuck 70 kV Power Line in eastern Fresno County in order to continue meeting energy demands and to improve electric transmission reliability in rural Fresno County. The reconductoring will involve installing new conductors within this power line section and replacing approximately eighteen wood poles with new wood poles (replacement of existing facilities) at various locations along the length of the power line. The Haas-Woodchuck 70 kV Power Line is located within an existing PG&E easement (existing utility easement) in the Sierra National Forest and begins at the Haas Power House, located off of Black Rock Road in rural Fresno County approximately six miles northeast of Balch Camp, and ending at Woodchuck Substation on McKinley Grove Road, approximately 0.7 miles south of Wishon Village near Wishon Reservoir. The poles being replaced will be approximately 10 to 15 feet taller than the existing poles to support the new conductors and maintain required ground clearances. Work will begin in November 2010, or as soon thereafter as possible, and will be completed by December 2011, or as soon thereafter as possible.

CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1., exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. The Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption(s):

- b) The replacement of existing power line facilities or supporting structures with equivalent facilities or structures.
- g) Power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, public utility easement; or in a utility corridor designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies for which a final Negative Declaration or EIR finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts.

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

Protests

Anyone wishing to protest this filing may do so by filing a protest with the CPUC and the Company by **October 18, 2010**, which is 21 days after the date of this filing. Protests should be mailed to the following address:

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CONSTRUCTION

PROJECT NAME: Haas-Woodchuck 70 kV Reconductoring Project (Fresno County) ADVICE LETTER NUMBER: 3742-E

Proposed Project: Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) proposes to replace existing wires (conductors) with new wires (reconductor) on approximately 7 miles of the Haas-Woodchuck 70 kV Power Line in eastern Fresno County in order to continue meeting energy demands and to improve electric transmission reliability in rural Fresno County. The reconductoring will involve installing new conductors within this power line section and replacing approximately eighteen wood poles with new wood poles (replacement of existing facilities) at various locations along the length of the power line. The Haas-Woodchuck 70 kV Power Line is located within an existing PG&E easement (existing utility easement) in the Sierra National Forest and begins at the Haas Power House, located off of Black Rock Road in rural Fresno County approximately six miles northeast of Balch Camp, and ending at Woodchuck Substation on McKinley Grove Road, approximately 0.7 miles south of Wishon Village near Wishon Reservoir. The poles being replaced will be approximately 10 to 15 feet taller than the existing poles to support the new conductors and maintain required ground clearances. Work will begin in November 2010, or as soon thereafter as possible, and will be completed by December 2011, or as soon thereafter as possible.

Exemption from CPUC Permit Requirement: CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III.B.1, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. Pacific Gas and Electric Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption(s):

- b) The replacement of existing power line facilities or supporting structures with equivalent facilities or structures.
- g) Power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, public utility easement; or in a utility corridor designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies for which a final Negative Declaration or EIR finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts.

Public Review Process: Persons or groups may protest the proposed construction if they believe that Pacific Gas and Electric Company has incorrectly applied for an exemption or that the conditions set out in Section III.B.2 of General Order 131-D exist;

- a. There is reasonable possibility that the activity may have an impact on an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies; or
- b. The cumulative impact of successive projects of the same type in the same place, over time, is significant; or
- c. There is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances.

Protests should include the following:

- 1. Your name, mailing address and daytime telephone number.
- 2. Reference to the CPUC Advice Letter Number and Project Name.
- 3. A clear description of the reason for the protest.
- 4. Whether you believe that evidentiary hearings are necessary to resolve factual disputes.
