Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E" or "the Company") hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

Purpose

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

Background

Due to an increase in electrical demand in Placer County, PG&E is replacing existing distribution wires beneath the Placer-Del Mar 60kV Power Line between the towns of Newcastle and Loomis in Placer County. In order to accommodate the new distribution conductors, PG&E proposes to replace approximately 23 poles that support both 60 kV power and 12 kV distribution lines (replacement of existing facilities). There will be no change in the capacity of the 60 kV conductor. The existing power line poles are wood and range in height from approximately 50 to 75 feet. They will be replaced with approximately 12 wood and 11 light-duty steel poles approximately 65 to 90 feet tall. The light-duty steel poles weather to resemble wood poles, but provide greater strength. The proposed project starts near the intersection of Gilardi Road and Navas Lane north of the Town of Loomis and continues approximately 1.25 miles northeast to a point near the intersection of Newcastle and Powerhouse Road in the Town of Newcastle (existing public utility easement). Construction is planned to begin in May 2011, or as soon as possible thereafter, with completion planned for April 2012, or as soon as possible thereafter.

CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting

authority to construct. The Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemptions(s):

- (b) "The replacement of existing power lines facilities or supporting structures with equivalent facilities or structures."
- (g) "Power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement; or in a utility corridor designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies for which a final Negative Declaration or EIR finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts."

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

Protests

Anyone wishing to protest this filing may do so by filing a protest with the CPUC and the Company by **March 2, 2011**, which is 20 days after the date of this filing. Protests should be mailed to the following address:

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CONSTRUCTION

PROJECT NAME: Placer-Del Mar 60kV Power Line Pole Replacement Project, Placer County
ADVICE LETTER NUMBER: 3799-E

Proposed Project: Due to an increase in electrical demand in Placer County, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) is replacing existing distribution wires beneath the Placer-Del Mar 60kV Power Line between the towns of Newcastle and Loomis in Placer County. In order to accommodate the new distribution conductors, PG&E proposes to replace approximately 23 poles that support both 60 kV power and 12 kV distribution lines (replacement of existing facilities). There will be no change in the capacity of the 60 KV conductor. The existing power line poles are wood and range in height from approximately 50 to 75 feet. They will be replaced with approximately 12 wood and 11 light-duty steel poles approximately 65 to 90 feet tall. The light-duty steel poles weather to resemble wood poles but provide greater strength. The proposed project starts near the intersection of Gilardi Road and Navas Lane north of the Town of Loomis and continues approximately 1.25 miles northeast to a point near the intersection of Newcastle and Powerhouse Road in the Town of Newcastle (existing public utility easement). Construction is planned to begin May 2011, or as soon as possible thereafter, with completion planned for April 2012, or as soon as possible thereafter.

Exemption from CPUC Permit Requirement: CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III.B.1, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. Pacific Gas and Electric Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption(s):

- b. The replacement of existing power lines facilities or supporting structures with equivalent facilities or structures.
- g. Power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement; or in a utility corridor designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies for which a final Negative Declaration or EIR finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts.

Public Review Process: Persons or groups may protest the proposed construction if they believe that Pacific Gas and Electric Company has incorrectly applied for an exemption or that the conditions set out in Section III.B.2 of General Order 131-D exist;

- a. There is reasonable possibility that the activity may have an impact on an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies; or
- b. The cumulative impact of successive projects of the same type in the same place, over time, is significant; or
- c. There is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances.

Protests should include the following:

1. Your name, mailing address and daytime telephone number.
2. Reference to the CPUC Advice Letter Number and Project Name.
3. A clear description of the reason for the protest.
4. Whether you believe that evidentiary hearings are necessary to resolve factual disputes.
