Subject: Submits Notice of Construction, Pursuant to General Order 131-D, for the Construction of the Lakeville No. 2 60kV Power Line Relocation – Marin-Sonoma Narrows Highway 101 Widening Project, Segment B3 – Marin County and Sonoma County

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (“PG&E” or “the Company”) hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

Purpose

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

Background

To accommodate the widening of Highway 101 from Novato in Marin County to Petaluma in Sonoma County (larger project), the State of California, Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has requested Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) to relocate two segments of the existing Lakeville No. 2 60 Kilovolt (kV) Power Line. On the first segment, PG&E will relocate approximately 1,560 feet of the power line approximately 100 feet to the east, replacing approximately 5 existing wood poles with approximately 7 new wood poles, beginning in Marin County on the east side of Highway 101, approximately 200 feet northeast of South San Antonio Road and continuing north along the east side of the highway. On the second segment, PG&E will relocate approximately 7,340 feet of power line from the west side of Highway 101 to the east side by replacing approximately 28 existing wood poles with approximately 27 new wood poles. This segment begins approximately 400 feet north of San Antonio Road, and parallels the east side of the highway as it continues north to a pole located approximately 575 feet south of Kastania Road in Sonoma County. On both segments, the new wood poles will be approximately 5 to 15 feet taller than the existing poles to comply with CPUC General Order 95 minimum ground-to-conductor clearance

requirements over hilly terrain, while accommodating Caltrans proposed improvements and electric distribution and communication wires on the power line poles (underbuild). Construction activities are tentatively scheduled to begin in February 2014, or as soon as project plans and approvals are in place, with completion in June 2014, or as soon as possible after construction begins.

CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, B.1, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. Pacific Gas and Electric Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption:

- f. power lines or substations to be relocated or constructed which have undergone environmental review pursuant to CEQA as part of a larger project, and for which the final CEQA document (Environmental Impact Report (EIR) or Negative Declaration) finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts caused by the proposed line or substation.

Caltrans and the Federal Highway Administration adopted an Environmental Impact Report / Environmental Impact Statement for the Marin-Sonoma Narrows HOV Widening Project, finding no significant unavoidable environmental impacts resulting from PG&E's required utility relocations (State Clearinghouse #2001042115, CEQA EIR document Link www.dot.ca.gov/dist4/msn).

The filing would not increase any current rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any rate schedule or rule.

Public Review Process: Persons or groups may protest the proposed construction if they believe that Pacific Gas and Electric Company has incorrectly applied for an exemption or that the conditions set out in Section III.B.2 of General Order 131-D exist;

- a. There is reasonable possibility that the activity may have an impact on an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies; or
- b. The cumulative impact of successive projects of the same type in the same place, over time, is significant; or
- c. There is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances.

Protests should include the following:

1. Your name, mailing address and daytime telephone number.
2. Reference to the CPUC Advice Letter Number and Project Name.
3. A clear description of the reason for the protest.
4. Whether you believe that evidentiary hearings are necessary to resolve factual disputes.
